

"Jesus, Peter and Me

Peter was the most outspoken of the disciples, but he often put his foot in his mouth. Yet God used him to accomplish great things. As we look at Peter, we learn a bit about ourselves. Join us as we look in the mirror and find Peter, the Rock, and our Lord standing nearby.

A Christian custom on Ash Wednesday is to receive a mark of the cross made with ashes upon the forehead. Ashes are a symbol of repentance and of our mortality, and draw us to where we can hear the Good News that we are forgiven and loved by our God. Tonight, due to social distancing, you will not receive the mark of ashes on your forehead, but you have received a card of ashes to remind you of this custom and to draw you to hear God's Good News of love and forgiveness.



THE LITANY

The litany is a responsive prayer of the church and is considered the most ancient of all services in the church except for Holy Communion. Luther regarded the litany as "next to the Lord's Prayer the very best that could be made" and encouraged its use and the litany today has remained similar as the reformers revised it four hundred years ago.

Our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope. Let us pray that our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son and in the power of His Holy Spirit, might richly bless this Lenten journey for us that we may come to Easter with glad hearts and keep the feast in sincerity and truth.

Matthew 26:30-35


