# Dear Friends in Christ,

Jesus, speaking to His disciples, says, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35).

"A new command." Yet it is an old one. It was Moses, way back in the book of Leviticus, directed by God to speak His commands to His people, who said "Do not seek revenge...but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord." (Leviticus 19:18)

Jesus amplified His command, however. We are to love, He said, "as I have loved you." How did Christ love us? At the time the disciples did not know the depth of Christ's love. They hadn't yet heard the story of the birth in Bethlehem announced by the angels. They had not yet been to Calvary and couldn't comprehend Jesus' references to His coming death. They had no idea that the Resurrection, Ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost were ahead.

We do have that knowledge. We have gathered together as God's people in His church to celebrate the love made flesh in the manger at Bethlehem. We gathered again in sorrow as we watch God die, not because of His actions, but because of our sins. But we

will also came together with joy, hope and faith on our walk to the empty tomb at Easter. Now, we hear those words that were spoken to us, "Why do you look for the living among the dead. He is not here. He has risen!" (Luke 24:6)

We understand what Jesus is talking about for we know how He has loved us. He has loved us enough to leave the glories of Heaven. He has loved us more than earthly power and status and honor. He has loved us more than He loved His own life.

Jesus further said that love for one another would be the mark of members of the Family of God. Just as He gave sight to the blind, made the lame man walk, and healed the sick, so did His followers. So we walk with Christ's love today. With the love of Christ in us, we visit the lonely, provide food for the hungry, and share our financial resources in order that the Word of God might be preached and bring many others into God's family. Loving others as Christ has loved us means that we can be willing to give all things on their behalf.

Sinful beings that we are, we are not prone to love others as Christ has loved us on our own. The apostle John tells us how it is possible: "Dear Friends," he writes in 1 John 4:7, "let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God." We are born of God, and, by His grace, we can carry out His command to love one another through all the opportunities He gives us with all the gifts He gives us.

And may the love of God shown on Easter fill you with all peace, joy, and love for others.

## **April Mission of the Month**

Stone Mountain, Georgia is home to a remarkably diverse ethnic, cultural, and religious gathering of people from around the world. It is also "home" for an increasingly large homeless and transient community of folk, many of whom can be found each day and night somewhere along a 3-4 mile stretch of Memorial Drive. Six days per week Rock of Ages Lutheran Church in Stone Mountain serves bag lunches for up to 300 people. Last year they (and partners) provided almost 19,000 meals.

From noon until 1pm every day except Saturday, an emergency meal is served. An "emergency" meal is one that does not require any cooking or refrigeration. It is basic nourishment for those who otherwise might not have anything to eat. A meal often consists of a sandwich, crackers, chips, granola bar, oatmeal pie, banana, and water. Once a week and on holidays, a hot meal is served. There are no "requirements" placed on those seeking food. All who come are fed.

Rock of Ages Lutheran Church is a suburban church serving an urban community. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church will help them in April by posting a sign up sheet asking each person who signs up to bring sandwiches to church on April 25<sup>th</sup>, and the sandwiches will be delivered to Rock of Ages following the church service.

Each sandwich will contain one slice of cheese and one slice of meat (turkey, ham, bologna or roast beef). Do not put any condiments on the bread because sandwiches are served for up to 6 days. Pack each individual sandwich in a sealed plastic bag and mark the bag with a date and type of meat. The more volunteers, the fewer sandwiches each person will have to make. One loaf of square sandwich bread will make 10 sandwiches.

Day 29 of the Red Letter Challenge refers us to Matthew 26:35, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink." And Matthew 26:40 concludes, "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me."

### **Our Sunday Morning Bible Class**

St. Paul's letter to the Romans is the first epistle in the New Testament because it is the longest, but it could also occupy that position because of its importance. It has always played an important role in the church because it summarizes so well the essential emphases of the apostle's theology. Throughout the letter Paul emphasizes that God's mercy comes to undeserving people who stand under the Law. In the Gospel of Jesus Christ, God freely gives righteousness through faith alone, not on the basis of their own accomplishments. This unconditional promise is the sole basis of people's relationship with God.

Martin Luther wrote, "This epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and it is truly the purest gospel. It is worthy not only that every Christian should know it word for word, by heart, but also that he should occupy himself with it every day...we can never read it or ponder over it too much."

### Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting March 21, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Walter Krause, Joe Peeples and Joshua Ringer were not in attendance.

The minutes from the February 14<sup>th</sup> Meeting were approved.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Mike Joost- A report was given on the status of our security camera system. The current system is obsolete with only 1 camera functional. A goal of a system of 10-12 cameras is preferred, to capture the important areas of the church. After discussion, Pastor Hayden will obtain commercial bids, to compare that cost to a self-installed system. It was also discussed that Mike from Ken's Stereo Junction in Macon, focuses on the audio/video needs of local churches. Pastor Hayden will meet with him to discuss other capabilities beyond the security system.

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven- The February treasurer reports were distributed for LOLC, Community Center and Anderson Fund. LOLC is \$26,938 in the black YTD through February. The Community Center is \$454 in the black through February.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- The February report was distributed.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

Church Properties: Barney Ross – An update was provided on the cause and repair of the water leak. Also, Davis Mortensen rented a woodchipper on 3/20, and Barney coordinated volunteers to chip the fallen trees on the corner lot.

**Lay Ministry:** Joe Peeples- Tom reported that Joe told him that Maundy Thursday will be an in-person service with Communion. The Good Friday service will also be in-person without Communion.

**Christian Education:** Joshua Ringer- Pastor Hayden reported that Children's Sunday School is going well and that we have been blessed by volunteers.

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Margaret Pedersen- 6 larges bins of snacks and sundries were delivered to the Putnam County Fire and Police for the February Mission. The March mission will be for Greene County Fire and Police. 48 volunteers gave blood on 2/16 for our

blood drive. 38 are signed up for the 3/24 blood drive. In April, LOLC will be supporting the Rock of Ages Lutheran Church in Stone Mountain, for their sandwich ministry for the homeless. Pastor Hayden will be providing details on this to the congregation at the 4/11 and 4/18 service, for donations on 4/25. The Little Pantry is successful, and Pastor Hayden has applied for a grant from the Synod. The coffee maker has been replaced. A discussion ensued on restarting post service Fellowship time.

Barney made a motion and was seconded: "I move that we restart Fellowship time following the service on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, with store bought snacks provided. The motion passed.

**Pastor's Report:** The Red-Letter Challenge has one week to go, with positive comments on the program. An email was sent to the congregation to opt into a text program that would allow LOLC to send out special notice texts, such as our cancellation of church for the water leak. The Episcopal Church of the Redeemer will be beginning services at LOLC on 3/27. We will not be charging rent immediately; resumption of rent will be determined. They had paid rent in 2020 without being able to hold services.

#### **Old Business:**

- **1. Apartment Furnishings-** The furnishings are still being stored at the church. They will be offered to anyone in the congregation. If no one is interested they will be donated to Habitat for Humanity.
- **2. Security Cameras** Discussed in VP report.
- **3. AED System-** The new system has been purchased and installed.

#### **New Business:**

**1. Passwords-** It was suggested that the Council President should have all passwords for all the relevant sites, so that there is a backup in case any passwords are lost or personnel leave. Pastor Hayden and Tom were supportive of that idea.

The meeting was adjourned.
