Dear Friends in Christ,

On the same day as the resurrection, Luke tells us that two friends were walking along the road to Emmaus. They didn't know, though, that it was Resurrection Day. That's why they were walking along with downcast faces. Then, along comes Jesus. "Hi," He says, "What's up? What have you been talking about?"

"Don't you know?" they ask incredulously. "Where have you been? Under a rock? We're talking about Jesus of Nazareth. He's dead now, but we were counting on Him for everything. Now our hope is gone. He's dead."

"No, no, no," Jesus responds. "Haven't you read your Bible? Don't you know this was all planned out before the world began?" And He starts at the beginning and patiently explains the prophecies of Scripture and how they have been fulfilled in the past few days. Finally, as they eat together, as Jesus takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it, and gives it to them, their eyes were opened. It's safe to say that their mouths were probably hanging open too as Jesus disappeared—from their physical sight, but not from their hearts and minds. Immediately they returned to Jerusalem with a new message: "The Lord has risen indeed..." (Luke 24:34)

We have our opportunities, too, to explain Scripture to the downcast, the bewildered, the confused. We can come alongside of our friends, our families, and maybe even those we do not know, on their "road to Emmaus" and ask, "Hey, what's up?" Many people, even those who claim to be Christian, still base their beliefs on what they think, on what they believe to be logical, and what others have said. Like Jesus, we can turn their thoughts to Scripture. We can invite them to church where they might receive Christ's body and blood and have their spiritual eyes opened.

By our actions, through our words, even by the work we do as a congregation in Milledgeville, we come alongside others who need to hear the Good News. During this Easter-time invite someone you know to worship. Help give them an opportunity to be pointed back to Scripture, to hear again how this was all part of God's plan for them. Let the Spirit send you with this same message: "The Lord has risen indeed…" (Luke 24:34)

The Good Samaritan. The Prodigal Son. The Pharisee and the Tax Collector. These stories from Jesus—recorded exclusively by St. Luke—are some of the most beloved in Holy Scripture. But despite the popularity of these passages, many students of Scripture would find it hard to describe what's unique about Luke's account of Jesus' life. They could not tell you what concerns drove Luke to take up his pen and write.

Luke's Gospel is a careful history of Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and ascension. But Luke's history, and Jesus' story, does not end with Jesus rising above the clouds. Prior to ascending into heaven, Jesus opened the minds of the apostles so that they could understand the Scriptures. He then commissioned them to preach the Good News about Him to all the nations (Luke 24:45-47). Thus, Christ's work continues today as He applies the benefits of His life, death, and resurrection—through His Word and Sacraments—personally and individually through the ministry of His Church. Luke is indeed a narrative about Christ, but it is even more. Through His means of grace Christ includes our story into His own.

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting March 12, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson followed by a prayer by Pastor Hayden. Don Menke was not in attendance.

The minutes from the February 12th council meeting were approved.

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Mike Joost- No report.

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven- The February reports were distributed and discussed. LOLC is showing a positive cash flow YTD of \$23K. The Community Center is showing a positive cash flow of \$3K YTD. There was a discussion regarding paying down the 3.625% variable interest Community Center mortgage with the \$102K in the LCEF savings account which earns .625%. It was also noted that the \$173K checking account is earning less than 1% interest.

A motion was made by Kathie and seconded by Bob. "I move that we transfer the \$102K in the LCEF savings fund to pay down the mortgage and take \$50K from the BankSouth operating fund and purchase a short-term interest-bearing investment. The amended motion passed. (See below) An amendment to the motion was made by Mike and seconded by Larry. "I move that we amend Kathie's motion to use \$100K from the operating fund vs \$50K." The amendment passed.

Financial Secretary: Walter Krause- The February report was distributed and reviewed. YTD donations are equal to the 2022 level of approximately \$80K.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

Church Properties: Barney Ross – The new emergency lights are operating. Pine straw will be purchased to spruce up the landscape.

Lay Ministry: Don Menke- no report

Christian Education: Bob Elkins- Five children attended Sunday School on March 12th. One additional teacher volunteer is needed.

Christian Service/Outreach: Margaret Pedersen- The last blood drive met its goal of 34 donations. The next blood drive is on April 6th. The Easter baskets have come in and will be assembled and delivered by the Tuesday Bible Study group. Operation Christmas Child will start after Easter. This year a box with items included can be purchased online for \$25 and donated. Or a box can be physically filled and donated by the individual. The afternoon/evening rotating Lenten lunch and dinners are going well with an average of 30 in attendance. A Congregational BBQ is being planned on September 9th by Jay McCrae.

Pastor's Report: Steve Hayden- The rotating lunch/dinner Lent services are being well received. Approximately the same numbers are attending but more new faces in the afternoon that were not attending in the evening. The Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services will both be at 7 PM, with Communion on Maundy Thursday, and on Easter Sunday, April 9th.

Old Business:

1. Hope Lutheran Church Committee- The committee has been formed; the first meeting is being scheduled.

2. Sanctuary Lighting/Emergency Lighting- New bulbs with better lighting and dispersion capabilities are replacing the current bulbs for a better overall lighting experience by Mike. This is an ongoing project. The Emergency lights are operational.

New Business:

1. GDOT Counteroffer/Acceptance- GDOT needs .248 acres of Lot 52 (corner lot) as well as .009 acres of easement. They will also pay for costs associated with moving and landscaping our sign on 44. The original proposal was for a total of \$105,100. GDOT agreed with our counteroffer of \$118,900 which includes the land and LOLC estimated costs. GDOT also needs .289 acres of Lot 50 (Community Center lot). They will also pay for costs associated with removing the septic and well, as well as connecting to new water and sewer service. They also provided costs associated with the parking lot and signage. The original offer was for \$181,600 which includes land and LOLC costs. GDOT agreed with the counter of \$190, 600.

A motion was made by Mike and seconded by Bob. "I move that the council recommend acceptance of the proposal to the congregation on Lot 50 as stated." The motion passed. A motion was made Mike and seconded by Kathie. "I move that the council recommend acceptance of the proposal to the congregation on Lot 52 as stated." The motion passed.

- 2. Congregation Stats due on 3/31/23- This has been completed by Pastor Hayden. The Congregation grew by a net of 7 members in 2022.
- 3. Register Congregation Presidential Election Voters (by 3/19/23)- The Synod votes for the national President prior to the national convention. Mike volunteered as the lay person voter. Larry and Margaret volunteered to certify that Mike is the named voter.
- 4. 2022 Financial Audit- Bob Elkins and Harold Solenberger are the 2-person committee. The audit is in progress.
- 5. The Episcopal Church of the Redeemer banner permission- The Episcopal Church would like permission to place a vinyl banner near the LOLC sign on 44 weekly from Friday-Sunday announcing their Saturday services.

A motion was made Kathie and seconded by Margaret. "I move that we give permission to the Episcopal Church to display their banner as described." The motion passed.

6. New copier lease agreement- The current 5-year copier lease and service agreement is expiring. Pastor Hayden reviewed the 2 proposals. Pastor Hayden recommends the Konica coper and service from Superior Company based on product features, service, and a lower cost.

A motion was made by Barney and seconded by Mike. "I move that we accept the proposal for the Konica copier and service from the Superior Company." The motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.
