As I write this, we have pushed into the heart of summer and the thermometer has been reminding us of that fact by moving higher and higher. As I look around, I don't see windows open with their curtains billowing softly in the breeze. Now the windows and doors are shut, the curtains or shades are pulled down tightly and the air-conditioners are roaring. As a part of my devotions, I read an article by Dr. Stephen Carter and I wanted to share it with you.

We walk out of air-conditioned buildings and face a blast furnace of hot, humid air. Soon the sweat begins to pour out. We hurry to complete our business so that we can again seek air-conditioned shelter. The heat and humidity create an environment that doesn't only control our schedule, it threatens to control our life!

We Christians also face the "heat and humidity" of a hostile world. Our Lord repeatedly warned His disciples to expect persecution. Peter speaks of a "fiery trial" that the early

Christians should expect. (1 Peter 4:12). But we today also face a culture that causes us as much trouble as the heat and humidity.

However, within the family of God's people, we can gather around Word and Sacrament and experience God's cooling refreshment before we walk out into the hostile world. As Jesus tells His disciples in John's gospel, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33b)

When faced with the blast furnace of temptation and ridicule, we begin to sweat. But Jesus, who faced the world's hatred and went to the cross in payment for our sins, offers us strength to face the world's heat and humidity. He has overcome. We can live boldly in the midst of the world's anti-Christian culture as He continues to refresh us in the air-conditioning of worship with God's people.

Operation Christmas Child 2022

Please continue to pray to God to prepare the hearts of children and their families to receive the Gospel and the Ministry Partners who are taking the 2021 shoebox gifts to children all over the world. Over 10.5 million shoeboxes were packed and donated worldwide in 2021. This number includes over 9.1 million boxes donated in the U.S. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church contributed 150 shoeboxes and received 415 shoeboxes during National Collection Week. LOLC's shoeboxes went to Burkina Faso, Republic of the Congo, Angola, and a "Hard-to-Reach" Area (difficult to access due to customs, cultural, or religious reasons). Thank you for your support and prayers.

We now prepare to begin our 2022 Operation Christmas Child (OCC) journey. OCC is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local Ministry Partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. The shoebox gifts are shipped outside the US to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease.

Our goal is to pack **150 boxes** for children ages 10 to 14 years old. We will be collecting items and donations of money starting in March and going through October focusing on groups of items needed each month. The items for each month will be outlined in an insert in our weekly church bulletin and email.

Overall, the items we will be collecting are:

Fishing kits Bar Soap Water bottles

Reusable cloth menstrual Nail clippers Bandanas pads Jump ropes Underwear

We have tried to make it easy again this year for everyone to order these items by setting up an Amazon Wish List for Operation Christmas Child. All you need to do is click on the link provided each month, purchase your item(s) and they will be shipped directly to the church. Just like a gift registry, you will be able to see how many of each item was purchased and how many are still needed. Takes all the hard work out of shopping! You may also purchase these items in any of our local stores such as

Walmart, Dollar Tree, CVS, etc. and drop them off in the bins we will have available in the narthex.

SAVE THE DATES: We plan have a <u>Packing Party</u> to pack each box, like we did last year, as a team on **November 5th**. <u>National Collection Week</u> is **November 14 – 21, 2022**.

New Business:

1. Amending Article III of the LOLC By-Laws.

The proposed change to Article III was distributed and reviewed by President Mathson. The number of annual congregational meetings required will be reduced from four to two. The document of the proposed changes is attached.

A motion was made by Dr. Ringer, and seconded by Barney, "I move that we accept the proposed changes to Article III as presented." The motion passed unanimously.

President Mathson updates:

- **1. Security Systems-** The security systems for the Church and Community Center have been installed and are working as planned.
 - 2. **Piano move and choir microphones-** The piano has been moved up from the floor and there have been new choir directional microphones installed.
 - 3. **Highway 44 expansion-** GDOT has presented an offer to buy .33 acres of the corner lot for Highway 44 widening. LOLC would receive approximately \$100K which would include the cost of moving the sign. GDOT will come back with an additional proposal for the Community Center. Both proposals will be considered at that time.
 - **4. Post Service Coffee Fellowship-** The congregation was asked to contact a council member or Elder to express a preference to have the fellowship food be provided by a local business or continue as it is now to be homemade by members.

The meeting was adjourned.

The current By-Laws of Lake Oconee Lutheran Church contain several terms and phrases that don't accurately represent our current practices or needs of the congregation. Below is Article III – GOVERNING BODIES, specifically section A. The current By-Law and the same section with the proposed changes are printed below with areas of change printed in red.

Current By-Law

Article III – GOVERNING BODIES

A. Voters Assembly. Any confirmed member who has reached the age of eighteen (18) years, and has <u>read</u> and <u>signed</u> the Constitution of this congregation shall be accepted as a voting member of this congregation. The Qualified members at any meeting constitute a quorum, and the meetings shall be governed by generally accepted parliamentary procedures. All meetings shall be announced at the regular worship services. <u>The Voters Assembly shall meet four times a year on a quarterly basis and the dates of such meetings shall be determined by the Church Council.</u> One meeting shall be held in the fall (<u>preferably October</u>) and will include consideration of the following years <u>preliminary</u> budget <u>which will be finalized for adoption at the next quarterly meeting.</u> The fall meeting will also include election of church officers and officials. Special meetings of the Voters Assembly may be called by the Pastor, the President of the congregation, the Church Council, or in response to a written request signed by at least ten (10) percent of the qualified voting members.

Proposed By-Law

Article III - GOVERNING BODIES

B. Voters Assembly. Any confirmed member who has reached the age of eighteen (18) years, and has read and accepted the Constitution of this congregation shall be accepted as a voting member of this congregation. The Qualified members at any meeting constitute a quorum, and the meetings shall be governed by generally accepted parliamentary procedures. All meetings shall be announced at the regular worship services. The Voters Assembly shall meet two times a year on a semi-annual basis and the dates of such meetings shall be determined by the Church Council. One meeting shall be held in the fall and will include consideration of the following years budget. The fall meeting will also include election of church officers and officials. Special meetings of the Voters Assembly may be called by the Pastor, the President of the congregation, the Church Council, or in response to a written request signed by at least ten (10) percent of the qualified voting members.
