ear Friends in Christ,

What would happen at Lake Oconee if we took the words of Jesus, read them, and actually put them into practice? What kind of response would our non-Christian friends and neighbors have to us? It seems like a simple idea, right?

This Lent, beginning February 14th, Lake Oconee Lutheran will kick off this "Red Letter Challenge" (RLC), a 40-day challenge where we as brothers and sisters in Christ are challenged to read the words of Jesus for 40 days straight. We'll do this by reading daily devotionals, attending a Bible study that goes along with what we are learning, listening to sermons and by being challenged in our walk with Jesus each of those 40 days.

This study will cause us to take a closer look at the words of Jesus... and then will challenge us to actually live out Jesus' words in our lives! You may have noticed that in many Bibles, the words of Jesus are printed in red letters. That's where this study gets its name. But when you combine a sermon series with Bible study and a personal workbook, all focused on putting those red letters into practice, you don't just have an all-church Bible study ... you have an all-church CHALLENGE!

As Christians, we are notorious for "nodding our heads" to God's promises and



commands, but then like a bobble-head toy, we continue to stay stuck in one place nodding our heads rather than moving our hands, feet and mouths in the ways that God directs. In this study, we are going to take to heart Jesus' words in John 14:15, "If you love me, keep my commands."

Why is this so important? Because whether we like to admit it or not, you and I are a reflection of Jesus Christ in this world. More and more people do not read the Bible these days, so the only thing they know about Jesus is what they experience by interacting with Christians. And sadly, as authors David Kinnamon and Gabe Lyons write in their book *unChristian*: "Many of those outside of Christianity ... reject Jesus because they feel rejected by Christians."

We'll learn five principles that were important to Jesus: **Being, Forgiving, Serving, Giving, and Going.**

1. **Being:** Before Jesus invites us to do things for Him, through Him, and in His name, He invites us into a relationship with Him – one of simply being in His presence. We need more of Him.
2. **Forgiving:** So many of us struggle with receiving God's forgiveness, forgiving ourselves, or forgiving others. To truly represent Jesus in this world, we must understand God's grace in our lives and extend that grace to others.
3. **Serving:** After all that Christ has done for us, we want to serve Him. But as we direct our love toward Him, He directs our love outward – into the community, to help those in need.
4. **Giving:** Jesus talked about money a lot. Why? Because how we view money reflects our relationship with God. Jesus followers are generous.
5. **Going:** Jesus' last command to His followers was to go out and tell the Good News of the Kingdom and what Christ has done for us. Doing good works is nice. But what turns those works into ministry is sharing them in the Name of Christ.


This church-wide campaign is based on the book *The Red Letter Challenge* by Lutheran pastor, Zach Zehnder. He wrote it with the hopes of equipping Jesus' followers through 40 days' worth of readings and challenges to practically and daily live out our faith. Following Jesus is simply reading His words and then acting on them.

My prayer is that you will be greatly blessed by taking the Red Letter Challenge, and by letting the words of Jesus shape you into His image for all to see.

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

For personal reasons, I have decided that it is in my best interest to leave my position at Lake Oconee Lutheran Church. I have been so thankful for this opportunity to grow in relationship with each of you and serve our community alongside one another. I pray the Lord's blessings for each of you.*

I was shocked and saddened to hear the news as you may be also. Like you, I was left with questions that would remain unanswered. So, what can we do now?

First of all pray...pray for Katherine as she goes through this change of plans and change in her life. Pray that God would continue to bless her and give her peace in trusting His presence. Pray for Lake Oconee Lutheran as we suddenly adjust to the change in our plans and deal with our personal grief which has resulted. Pray that God will continue, as promised, to accomplish His will, both through Katherine and through us as we continue to serve our community.

Secondly trust....trust that God does keep and fulfill the promises that He has made to each of us. We are not alone and forsaken, but He is present here among us (and with Katherine) in Word and Sacrament. And when the circumstances of life seem to be out of our control, we continue to trust that our creator God is in control.

Finally hope...St. Paul writes, **“For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe”** (1 Ti 4:10). And of course, in Romans we read, **“<sup>2</sup> Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. <sup>3</sup> More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, <sup>4</sup> and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, <sup>5</sup> and hope does not put us to shame, because God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.”** (Ro 5:2-5) Did you hear that? Hope does not put us to shame!

May God bless Katherine and may He bless us as we continue to pray, trust and hope in Him. If you have any questions or would like to talk about this more, please either contact Pastor Steve or your elder. We may not have all the answers that you are seeking, but we can sit, listen, pray, trust and hope along with you.

As you can tell if you examined the 2021 budget which was approved at our December congregational meeting, with the addition of the potential hiring of a full time DCE and the addition of other payroll increases and general increases in costs of most everything, our 2021 budget reflects yet another increase over the previous year.

I sincerely hope everyone will prayerfully consider what they are able to pledge in the coming weeks to see that we are able to meet our income budget once again.

Each committee chairperson has been provided with a copy of their budget for 2021. I will be closely monitoring all expenditures as I have in the past. If you are not a chairperson but have reason to purchase anything for which you expect to be reimbursed, please contact the committee chairperson first to be sure they approve the purchase within their budget and then have them sign the receipt before you submit it to me for reimbursement. In this way we can be certain that we are being good stewards of the blessings our Lord has provided to us.

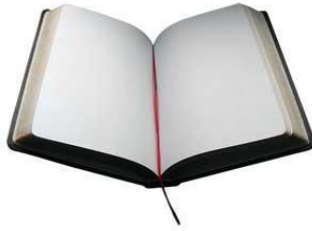

Council Meeting  
January 10, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Walter Krause was not in attendance.

The minutes from the November 15th Council Meeting was approved. Also, the minutes from the November 29<sup>th</sup> Special meeting and the December 13<sup>th</sup> Congregational meeting were approved.

**Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Mike Joost- No report

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven- 2021 Budgets were distributed to council members for their area of responsibility. The December treasurer reports were distributed, LOLC, Community Center and Anderson Fund. It was discussed that GFL trash had not credited a payment made. Barney will follow up with them.

The current bookkeeping process by Kathie was briefly reviewed. It was noted that financial backups are not on the church computer system. Pastor Hayden will discuss with Kathie and obtain passwords to access the Ledger Cloud system going forward. It was mentioned that LOLC had a positive cash flow of \$50,669 for 2020. The Community Center also has a positive flow of \$1,002 for the 2020.

Mike made a motion and was seconded: **I move that we authorize a credit card for the Church Secretary with the appropriate limits.** The motion was approved. Pastor Hayden mentioned that this is to be used to order supplies online.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- The December report was distributed. December giving was over December 2019 giving by \$3,987.

**Congregational Secretary:** Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties:** Barney Ross – A group of members will be removing additional trees on the corner lot this week. Also, Barney will be replacing rotted wood and sills at the Community Center and will be donating the supplies. Mike will be working to replace exterior lights at the Community Center and will donate the cost.

**Lay Ministry:** Joe Peoples- Sonya has completed her probationary period. Ash Wednesday service will be an in-person event with communion. All other Wednesdays will be online.

**Christian Education:** Joshua Ringer- Childrens Sunday School will begin on January 17<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 to 10:30 AM.

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Margaret Pedersen- Has met with Katherine to begin coordination.

Time and Talent Sheets will be distributed this month. A virtual trivia night is being discussed, as well as adding a Fellowship coordinator. Ideas are being discussed on how to better promote the Little Free Pantry. The Blood Drive was a success with 43 people donating.

**DCE:** Katherine Lutz- Snacks were provide to those donating blood at the drive, as well as information about LOLC. Katherine will explore changing the name of the Community Center on Google Maps. The January Mission is supporting the Circle of Love Center which provides support services for domestic abuse victims. We will be providing assorted items such soap, towels, cleaning, and hygiene items. The February Mission is in development, it will provide a care basket for our area police and fire personnel.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Hayden- The new sign on 44 has been installed and was paid for by Lutheran Church Extension. The Time and Talent Sheets will be distributed at the January 24<sup>th</sup> Service. Katherine will be traveling to Chicago at the end of January for a conference at Concordia which is required for her internship program.

#### **Old Business:**

1. **Community Center Pathway-** Pastor Hayden presented bids for a 46' x 5' path from the parking lot to the Southwest corner of the Community Center which ranged from \$3-4K. It was discussed and providing the path to the Northwest corner would take it to the backdoor which may be more functional. Paster Hayden will request bids for this. Barney will also contact Jim Randolph to discuss grading costs.

#### **New Business:**

1. LCMS is asking for a congregational vote to authorize delay of District and Synodical Conventions for 1 additional year due to COVID-19 restrictions. It would take the usual 3-year span into a (one time only) 4-year span. A vote is necessary due to constitutional expectations. A Convention Referendum was distributed which explained this in detail.

Kathie made a motion and was seconded: **I move that we vote yes, allowing for the delay as requested in the Convention Referendum document.** The motion was approved. Pastor Hayden will report our approval to the LCMS.

The meeting was adjourned.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
