ear Friends in Christ,

Pastor Zach Zehnder tells us a story about Matthew Emmons. He was an American sharpshooter in the 2004 Athens Olympics—and he was far and away the best sharpshooter in the world. That year the question wasn't who is going to win the gold, but who would take the other medals. Everyone knew that Matthew Emmons was going to win the gold.

Going into his final shot, Emmons was in first place by a mile, and all he needed to do to win the gold was hit the target—anywhere on the target. He took aim, fired, and hit the bullseye. It sounds great, except for one small fact: he actually shot at the wrong target, one lane over. The mistake is known as a “crossfire”, and Matthew got a score of 0. He dropped from first to eighth and didn't medal.

Why does Pastor Zehnder bring this up now? Because, he says, people need clear targets. As Christians we can have the best intentions in the world, but if we are succeeding at things that don't actually matter, we can do more harm than good.



So what are the right targets for a disciple of Jesus?

Last year, Lake Oconee walked through Lent studying the Red Letter Challenge, focusing on 5 targets to shoot for as a disciple of Jesus. Do you remember them?

- Being
- Forgiving
- Serving
- Giving
- Going

But though all of these targets are important, perhaps the most important is BEING in a relationship with Jesus. It's at the center of all the others and if we don't hit this one, we won't succeed at any of the others.

This year, during Lent, join us for another challenge from Pastor Zehnder; the Being Challenge. We will focus on the ways in which Jesus spent time being in a relationship with God to help us be in a close relationship with God. During this challenge, we will focus on 5 key habits that Jesus practiced in His relationship with God and see how they can help shape our lives as well.

Join me during this season of Lent in worship, in Bible class, and in daily devotions for the Being Challenge, daily devotions that will lead us to a deeper relationship with God and help us make a big difference in the world.

Our challenge at LOLC begins on **Sunday, February 27<sup>th</sup>** and continues through **Palm Sunday, April 10<sup>th</sup>**. 

## Mid - Week Bible Class

A psalm is a song or poem distinguished by its devotional character and deep piety. It is the faith of the Old Testament set to music, a poem springing from an encounter with God. It is worship literature. The book of Psalms, as we know it, was not made-it grew, just as our hymnals were not made but grew as person after person through the centuries expressed deep spiritual experiences in poetic form.

Christ loved the psalms. Raised as a Jewish boy, He was nourished on the psalms of His people. The psalms were read and sung in His home. He heard them in the synagogue. Later, at His Baptism, His vocation as Messiah was affirmed with Ps. 2:7, "You are My Son." In the night in which He was betrayed, after Jesus instituted the Last Supper, He and the eleven sang a hymn before going to the Mount of Olives (Matt. 26:30). On the cross, when His agony was greatest, Jesus used the words of David (Ps. 22:1) to express the horror of forsakenness. On Easter evening, when Jesus startled the eleven by His sudden appearance, He declared that everything written about Him in the psalms must be fulfilled (Luke 24:44).

Most people who know anything about the Bible know a few "literary gems" from the Psalms. But if you are not satisfied with a few oft-quoted verses, then come to a full banquet. You are invited to sit down at the table and enjoy the spiritual food found in the Psalms. Real people, who had real problems and joys, wrote the Psalms. Just as God spoke to the writers of the Psalms, so He speaks to you today.

## Our Sunday Morning Bible Class

The Book of Esther is a wonderful, true story of God watching over His people and delivering them from certain death. It tells the tale of the young, beautiful Jewish girl, who by God's gracious providence became queen of Persia. With Mordecai, her protective and loving cousin, Esther saves her people by exposing a cruel plot to exterminate the Jews remaining in Persia, who chose not to return to the Promised Land.

Although God is never mentioned in the book, He is not hard to find in the many “coincidences,” ironic twists, and reversals recorded therein. Some interpreters have gone so far as to say that God, even in His apparent absence, is the book’s main character. Working behind the scenes, God inspires faith in His gracious promises and enables His children to accomplish extraordinary things on behalf of their neighbor.

## Council Meeting

### January 9, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, and Pastor Hayden opened with a prayer.

Larry Davis and Josh Ringer were not in attendance.

The minutes from the December 12<sup>th</sup> Congregational meeting were approved by council.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Mike Joost- No report

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven- The three Treasurer's Reports were distributed and reviewed. LOLC was \$23,966 in the black for 2021. The mortgage balance is at \$300K. Historically LOLC has sent additional funds to pay down the mortgage in years with a budget surplus.

Kathie made a motion and was seconded. **"I move to authorize the Treasurer to pay down \$25K of the mortgage."** The motion passed.

Kathie reported that a gift has been received to establish the **Ann Mortensen Memorial Fund**. Kathie will be establishing a new bank account to accept the funds. Details to follow on the plans for the Ann Mortensen Memorial Fund.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- The 2021 report was distributed and discussed. LOLC was behind in donations versus 2020. There was a large lump donation in 2020 of \$30K which made for a larger donation year in 2020 than 2021.

**Congregational Secretary:** Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties:** Barney Ross – no report

**Lay Ministry:** Joe Peeples- Pastor Tom Martel will be our visiting Pastor on 1/16.

**Christian Education:** Joshua Ringer- No Report

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Margaret Pedersen- The blood drive on January 6<sup>th</sup> received thirty-nine donations.

**Pastor's Report:** Steve Hayden- Pastor gave thanks and prayed that LOLC has been blessed to be able to paydown our mortgage to below \$300K. He and Linda also thanked the congregation for their Christmas gifts. Pastor Hayden will be gone for the service on 1/16 to attend his father's memorial service. January 30<sup>th</sup> is the date for the installation of the church officers during worship service.

**New Business:**

- 1. Lay Delegate to the District Convention-** The District Convention is being held in St. Augustine, Florida on June 16-18, 2022. LOLC will send Pastor Hayden and a Lay representative. Kathie volunteered as the Lay Delegate, and Mike will be the alternate if Kathie cannot attend.
  - 2. Girl Scout Troop Sleepover-** Sonya, our church secretary, started a Girl Scout troop with ten members including her daughter. She has requested the use of the church on a Friday night in March for a sleepover for the troop and 4-6 parent chaperones. There were no objections to this.
  - 3. Lake Country Chorus Concert-** The Lake Country Chorus Concert that is being held at LOLC has been rescheduled from 3/31/22 to 3/29/22.

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.
