Sunday Morning Bible class

The Good Samaritan. The Prodigal Son. The Pharisee and the Tax Collector. These stories from Jesus—recorded exclusively by St. Luke—are some of the most beloved in Holy Scripture. But despite the popularity of these passages, many students of Scripture would find it hard to describe what's unique about Luke's account of Jesus' life. They could not tell you what concerns drove Luke to take up his pen and write.

Luke's Gospel is a careful history of Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and ascension. But Luke's history, and Jesus' story, does not end with Jesus rising above the clouds. Prior to ascending into heaven, Jesus opened the minds of the apostles so that they could understand the Scriptures. He then commissioned them to preach the Good News about Him to all the nations (Luke 24:45-47). Thus, Christ's work continues today as He applies the benefits of His life, death, and resurrection—through His Word and Sacraments—personally and individually through the ministry of His Church. Luke is indeed a narrative about Christ, but it is even more. Through His means of grace Christ includes our story into His own.

Mid Week Bible Class

We all have sung hymns in worship (and often complained about them). But what are they actually? Are they just musical entertainment, breaks where we can whisper to others or go to the restroom, time to stretch or re-arrange? Lutheran hymns are not breaks from worship, but a central part of worship. They concisely teach pure, clear Biblical doctrine in a way that reinforces the theme of the day in worship and teaches us using music. Hymns have always been a part of Lutheran worship beginning with Martin Luther who urged churches to use them as a vehicle for proclaiming the Gospel. He writes, "Next to theology, I accord to music the highest place and greatest honor." Join us on Wednesday mornings at 10:30am for our Zoom Bible study as we study the Biblical teaching of the Hymn of the Day which will be sung at the next Sunday Worship service.

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson followed by a prayer by Pastor Hayden.

The minutes from the November 13th council meeting were approved

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Mike Joost- no report

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven- No report, November financials will be emailed to the council this week for review.

Financial Secretary: Walter Krause- A special gift of \$10K was given to the general fund by a member LOLC above their regular offering. Rent of \$250 was received for the use of the church by the "Save 44" group.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

Church Properties: Barney Ross – no report

Lay Ministry: Don Menke- The 2023 Elders and groupings have been posted on the bulletin board.

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer- no report

Christian Service/Outreach: Margaret Pedersen- The last blood drive saw a record of 50 donations.

Operation Christmas Child is complete with a total of 392 boxes donated. The Eatonton Messenger ran a nice article about our work on operation Christmas Child.

The Mission of the Month is the Little Free Pantry. After a post by Pastor Hayden regarding Little Free Pantry being in need, Margaret posted on Next Door. LOLC received a \$2500 donation after a person from Next Door inquired on how he could help. The senior class from Gatewood School also donated food.

Pastor's Report: Steve Hayden- A reminder that the Christmas Eve service is at 7 PM, and Christmas Day is at 10 AM. The final Advent service will be an afternoon with a lunch service. If this is popular, we may continue this for some of the Lenten services

Voting took place this year at LOLC for the November election and December run-off.

Ka'Niyah Robertson, a recipient of the Lake Oconee Youth Alliance scholarship with support from LOLC, will be attending our service on Sunday, 12/18, along with the program head, Janice Went.

Youngmi Kim has a music student who is willing to intern during the school year in the choir every Sunday. LOLC would pay the student \$40 per week.

A motion was made by Mike and seconded by Walter, "I move that we hire one student through the end of the academic year to sing in the choir for \$40 per week to be paid by the congregation." The motion passed. Mike had previously made a motion to pay personally for half of this cost, however an amendment was made and voted on to have LOLC pay the entire \$40 per week.

The Epiphany Lutheran Church of Jackson, Mississippi the first historically black LCMS church was a victim of arson recently. A donation for the church was suggested by one of our members.

A motion was made by Tom, and seconded by Mike, "I move that we donate the remainder of the 2022 Benevolent fund up to \$500 to the Epiphany Congregation." The motion passed.

Pastor Hayden met with Dr Peter Meyer, Head of Mission for the GA/FL District to discuss the closing of the Hope Lutheran Church in Milledgeville on January 22nd. The district will be taking ownership of the church assets including the building. The district is inquiring if LOLC would have interest in helping to establish some sort of ministry at the current location.

For example, a student ministry, Community Service, a new congregation etc. It was decided to call a special meeting of the Elders and Church Councill to discuss ideas and interest on January 23rd at 10 AM.

Old Business:

- 1. Greene County Christian Outreach- The organization has closed.
- 2. Hope Lutheran Closing- Discussed above

New Business:

1. Sanctuary Lighting/Emergency Lighting- Mike and Barney discussed the need to replace/upgrade our current Sanctuary lighting. The Emergency Lighting system is not working, and new batteries are needed as

well. After a detailed discussion of the Sanctuary lighting problem, Mike and Barney volunteered to reach out to companies specializing in Church lighting. They will report at a future council meeting on costs and solutions suggested and next steps.

2. Date and Time for removal of Christmas Decorations. - January 7th at 10 AM.

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.


