# **Sunday Morning Bible class**

The Book of Judges covers the time following the death of Joshua until the prophet Samuel, who anointed David king over Israel. Covering almost 450 years, Judges shows how God faithfully sought after His people even after they broke His covenant with them. God commanded Israel to drive out the Canaanites from the Promised Land. However, Israel disobeyed. Instead, Israel "did what was evil in the sight of the LORD and served the Baals" (Judges 2:11). In their disobedience, God's beloved people forfeited many blessings and instead were visited by anarchy and chaos. Israel forgot God, but He never forgot them. He sought after them to restore His blessings to them. We call that grace.

Our study of the Book of Judges will focus on God's assuring words found in its pages, "I will never break My covenant with you" (Judges 2:1). That covenant is fulfilled, offered, and delivered in the new covenant through His Son, Jesus Christ. Join us on Sunday mornings at 9 am in the Church or live-streamed on Facebook for Judges.

## **Operation Christmas Child 2022**

Please continue to pray to God to prepare the hearts of children and their families to receive the Gospel and the Ministry Partners who are taking the 2021 shoebox gifts to children all over the world. Over 10.5 million shoeboxes were packed and donated worldwide in 2021. This number includes over 9.1 million boxes donated in the U.S. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church contributed 150 shoeboxes and received 415 shoeboxes during National Collection Week. LOLC's shoeboxes went to Burkina Faso, Republic of the Congo, Angola, and a "Hard-to-Reach" Area (difficult to access due to customs, cultural, or religious reasons). Thank you for your support and prayers.

We now prepare to begin our 2022 Operation Christmas Child (OCC) journey. OCC is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local Ministry Partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. The shoebox gifts are shipped outside the US to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease.

Our goal is to pack **150 boxes** for children ages 10 to 14 years old. We will be collecting items and donations of money starting in March and going through October focusing on groups of items needed each month. The items for each month will be outlined in an insert in our weekly church bulletin and email.

Overall, the items we will be collecting are:

Sewing kits Deodorant Recorder/ Harmonica

Fishing kits Bar Soap Water bottles
Reusable cloth menstrual Nail clippers Bandanas
pads Jump ropes Underwear

String backpacks Playing cards Socks
Flip flops School supplies Postage

We have tried to make it easy again this year for everyone to order these items by setting up an Amazon Wish List for Operation Christmas Child. All you need to do is click on the link provided each month, purchase your item(s) and they will be shipped directly to the church. Just like a gift registry, you will be able to see how many of each item was purchased and how many are still needed. Takes all the hard work out of shopping! You may also purchase these items in any of our local stores such as

Walmart, Dollar Tree, CVS, etc. and drop them off in the bins we will have available in the narthex.

**SAVE THE DATES**: We plan have a <u>Packing Party</u> to pack each box, like we did last year, as a team on **November 5th**. <u>National Collection Week</u> is **November 14 – 21**, **2022**.

Thank you so much for your kind generosity as we spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to children in need across the globe.

#### Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting June 22, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, Pastor Hayden opened with a prayer.

Barney Ross and Josh Ringer were not in attendance.

The minutes from the May 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting were approved by council.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Mike Joost- no report

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven- The three Treasurer's Reports were distributed and reviewed. Receipts are over budget by \$18K YTD. Expenses are \$10K over budget, however an extra mortgage payment of \$25K has been made. Income exceeds expenses by \$8K YTD. The Community Center continues to operate in the black by \$3K YTD.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- report was distributed and discussed. Regular donations of \$160K are in line YTD with 2021.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties:** Barney Ross – Bughouse has been contacted to provide an estimate for wildlife exclusion in the attic.

**Lay Ministry:** Joe Peeples- Pastor's vacation requests for the rest of the year have been covered except for Thanksgiving week. Continuing to work on that week.

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer- no report

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Margaret Pedersen- The blood drive was on June 2<sup>nd,</sup> and they met their goals. The food pantry and Operation Christmas Child continue as usual. A suggestion was made to provide the food for the post-service fellowship from Publix. This would be paid for by LOLC. The weekly volunteers could pick it up and set it up. The Pastor will discuss this during announcements on June 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Pastor's Report:** Steve Hayden- Pastor will be taking all of his annual vacation days in the second half of 2022.

A memorial donation of \$5,000 was made by Ed Blosser to use to benefit children in memory of Lillian's work in helping children in her life. The council will discuss suggestions to best use this memorial donation in keeping with Ed's wishes.

A job description is being passed on to Dave for use to pursue an intern from UGA for a choir director. The church will need to hire a piano mover to reposition the piano.

A motion was made by Margaret, and seconded by Mike, "I move that we contract a piano mover to reposition the piano. "The motion passed.

#### **Old Business:**

**1. Mortenson Memorial Fund Update-** A visit is scheduled to visit the Gwinnett County Food Cooperative on 6/22.

**UGA Interns-** Discussed in Pastor's report.

Janitorial staff changes- Sonya has taken over the janitorial responsibilities every Friday.

Rodent Roundup- Discussed in Barney's report.

**Microphone Update-** Mike has obtained Choir microphones for \$385 and a wi-fi device for the Community center for \$131. Installation will be complete in the coming weeks.

#### **New Business:**

1. **Voter's meeting-** We will hold a Congregational Voters meeting on July 10<sup>th</sup>. One piece of business will be an amendment to the by-laws to reduce the requirement for Quarterly Congregational meetings.

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.
