A few weeks ago, I spent time visiting my parents at their home. It was good to be back together after the forced separation of the pandemic. While I was there I helped with some light maintenance projects and my dad mentioned that he needed to schedule a service on his whole home generator.

Purchased years ago, his generator is wired into the house and set to automatically kick on whenever the regular power fails. It will keep everything in the house running until the main power is restored. That is good news because in today's world losing power is a problem. If the power fails it becomes hard to keep the temperature comfortable, hard to keep stored food safe, hard to keep the lights on. And nobody likes it when the lights are out.

There is one light, however, that never goes out—the light of God's love that shines through us. The Bible tells us that Christians are the "light of the world." Jesus says,

"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in

the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men that they may praise Your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16

Sin throws darkness over the world, but God showed us the brightness of His love through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Now God's power, love and brightness live in our lives, not just on Christmas or Easter, but every day. God's light shines through our words and actions. By the power of the Spirit they splash light on everyone who is around us.

Storms may still blow through our lives with "sound and fury" as the old saying goes, but isn't it nice to know that now the lights can never go out. Every day is a new chance to share this light with those all around us.

The Church Council at their May meeting approved several changes to our way of Worship together. These changes will take effect **beginning Sunday**, **June 6th**.

- Beginning June 6th, mask wearing will be optional during Worship and Bible class time. You may choose whether you would like to continue to wear your mask throughout the service, or not to wear one. As the percentage of complete vaccinations increases and with the introduction of coffee hour, the Council felt this was appropriate. We continue to encourage you to allow room for social distancing.
- Beginning June 6th, we will resume serving communion at the railing with some modifications.
- 1. There will be fewer people ushered to the railing each time, so we ask you to leave space between households.
- 2. We are asking you not to kneel and remain standing for communion. This will avoid the spread of germs through the communion rail.
- 3. The common cup will still not be used, only the individual cups will be offered.
- 4. The self-contained communion cups and wafers that we have been using will continue to be available. If you desire to receive communion at your seat and not come forward, you may continue that practice.
- 5. Pastor and the communion assistant will be masked during the distribution.

Above all, we encourage you, in love, to be patient as we navigate these changes and iron out any unforeseen difficulties that we encounter. You may help us in this transition by signing up to serve as ushers for communion Sundays. If you have any questions, you are always invited to speak with Pastor Steve, Joe Peeples (Chair of the Board of Elders) or Tom Mathson (Congregational President). Thank you.

### Mission of the Month

Why are we talking about Christmas already you may ask? Well, we want to make you aware of this year's campaign for Operation Christmas Child. Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. They ship these simple gifts outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to children living on Native American reservations in the U.S.

Our goal this year is to pack **150 boxes**, up from the 100 boxes we packed last year. We will be collecting items and donations of money starting in May and going through October focusing on groups of items needed each month. The items for each month will be outlined in an insert in our weekly church bulletin.

Overall, the items we will be collecting are for boys and girls aged 5-9:

Stuffed Animals Harmonica or woodwind recorder

Comb Toothbrush Washcloth Bar Soap

Lip balm (non-liquid) Colored pencils
Small pencil sharpener Small notebooks

Safety (blunt tip) scissors Glue stick (no liquid glue)

Sunglasses Stickers

Yo-yo

All you need to do is click on the link listed below, purchase your item(s) and they will be shipped directly to the church. Just like a gift registry, you will be able to see how many of each item was purchased and how many are still needed. Takes all the hard work out of shopping! You may also purchase these items in any of our local stores such as Walmart, Dollar Tree, CVS, etc. and drop them off in the bins we will have available in the narthex.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans is the first epistle in the New Testament because it is the longest, but it could also occupy that position because of its importance. It has always played an important role in the church because it summarizes so well the essential emphases of the apostle's theology. Throughout the letter Paul emphasizes that God's mercy comes to undeserving people who stand under the Law. In the Gospel of Jesus Christ, God freely gives righteousness through faith alone, not on the basis of their own accomplishments. This unconditional promise is the sole basis of people's relationship with God.

Martin Luther wrote, "This epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and it is truly the purest gospel. It is worthy not only that every Christian should know it word for word, by heart, but also that he should occupy himself with it every day...we can never read it or ponder over it too much."

### Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting via Zoom May 11, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Walter Krause, Joshua Ringer and Margaret Pedersen were not in attendance.

The minutes from the April 11<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Mike Joost- No Report

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven- The LOLC, Community Center and Anderson Fund Reports were presented. LOLC is ahead by \$52K YTD in Giving and \$60K YTD in positive cash flow. It was discussed that the road to the church owned by the Presbyterian church needs repair. A member of LOLC is contributing for the cost of the temporary repairs.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- The April report was presented and discussed.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties:** Barney Ross – The Pest control company will be visiting the church next week, to assess the success of the squirrel traps in the attic. Barney and Mike will work together to determine if the Pastor's microphone can be repaired.

**Lay Ministry:** Joe Peeples- Lay Ministry discussed going back to Communion at the rail. The council discussed the merits of going mask-optional at worship services going forward.

Kathie made a motion and was seconded: "I move that beginning on June 6<sup>th</sup> that worship service will be mask-optional." The motion passed.

Joe made a motion and was seconded: "I move that we resume Communion at the railing beginning at the June 6<sup>th</sup> service, while also continuing to offer Communion in the seats." The motion passed.

**Christian Education:** Joshua Ringer- Pastor Hayden communicated that Children's Sunday School will go on break for the Summer beginning in June and will resume in the Fall. Adult Sunday School will continue through the Summer.

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Margaret Pedersen- Tom communicated Margaret's report. Blood Drive Coordinator, Pam Kunz reported that 36 donations were made on April 21 and the next event is on May 20<sup>th</sup>. The Sandwich ministry at Rock of Ages was provided 350 sandwiches which were delivered by Barbara Hardesty on April 25<sup>th</sup>.

Operation Christmas Child is coordinated by Carol Campbell, Sue Davis, and Cindy Helms, and are

collecting monthly designated items from May-October. The Packing party for the items will be on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Kayleen Ringer and Linda Hayden reported that the Little Free Pantry continues to be well used, and many volunteers have signed up to donate and stock the pantry. The Fellowship hour resumed on May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Homemade snacks will also be provided going forward.

**Pastor's Report:** Steve Hayden-Two items were purchased from funds from Memorial gifts. A silver Lectern and a Floor stand offering box. Pastor Hayden will be on vacation at the end of May, which will include the May 23<sup>rd</sup>, and May 30<sup>th</sup> services. Pastor Ron (5/23) and Pastor Larry Townsend (5/30) will be serving those Sundays for Bible Study and the Worship Service. Pastor Hayden will begin recruiting ushers for Communion, with an announcement at the 5/16 service.

#### **Old Business:**

1. Security Cameras- Pastor Hayden has received one bid and will receive a second bid on April 19<sup>th</sup>, which will be discussed at the next council meeting.

#### **New Business:**

1. Computer upgrade for Pastor- Due to extra needs of videoing of the services, a more sophisticated computer is anticipated in the future.

Barney made a motion and was seconded: "I move that we authorize up to \$1500 to upgrade to a new computer for Pastor Hayden." The motion passed.

- 2. Return to more normal Communion Format- Discussed and handled earlier in the meeting.
- **3. Support for "People Like Us" area ministry-** Joe presented a request of support from the "People Like Us" new halfway house for men in Union Point. The organization needs a new HVAC system. Joe will be meeting with the head of the organization on May 14<sup>th</sup> to better understand the goals of the program and their needs. He will report back at the next council meeting.

The next council meeting will be held in person on June 13<sup>th</sup>.

The meeting was adjourned.
