**D**ear Friends in Christ,

Habits play a very important part of our lives and often they unintentionally spill over into other areas of our lives. Physical examples are the habits of making your bed, flossing your teeth, and exercising regularly. These habits can influence your mood, make you feel and look healthier and increase your energy.

But I believe that no habits create a greater domino effect in our lives than spiritual habits. Ultimately all of our doing in this world should effectively come out of our being in relationship with God. If that's true, then our major focus in life should always be in growing in our relationship with God.

How do we grow in our relationship with God? Look to Jesus. He is the only perfect person who has ever existed in perfect relationship with God. He is the perfect person we look to as our example in this world.

Even Jesus tells us this: Matthew 11:29: Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace.



Jesus is inviting us into a way of life where He leads and we follow Him. The more we sit at his feet and learn from Him, the more we become like Him. The more His habits become our habits. And the more these habits will begin to feel like unforced rhythms of grace in our lives.

Listen to how Eugene Peterson summarizes Paul's word to Timothy in 1 Peter 4:7-8: Exercise daily in God – no spiritual flabbiness, please! Workouts in the gymnasium are useful, but a disciplined life in God is far more so, making you fit both today and forever.

So what habits did Jesus have in his life? To find out, Lake Oconee Lutheran has kicked off this "Red Letter Challenge" (RLC), a 40-day challenge where we as brothers and sisters in Christ are challenged to read the words of Jesus for 40 days straight. We are doing this by reading daily devotionals, attending a Bible study that goes along with what we are learning, listening to sermons and by being challenged in our walk with Jesus each of those 40 days.

This study causes us to take a closer look at the words of Jesus... and then challenges us to actually live out Jesus' words in our lives, to develop habits like Jesus! You may have noticed that in many Bibles, the words of Jesus are printed in red letters. That's where this study gets its name. But when you combine a sermon series with Bible study and a personal workbook, all focused on putting those red letters into practice, you don't just have an all-church Bible study ... you have an all-church CHALLENGE!

Join us every Sunday (and every day in your own devotion) for the Red Letter Challenge. It's not too late!!



Council Meeting  
February 14th, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Walter Krause, Larry Davis, and Barney Ross were not in attendance.

The minutes from the January 10th Council Meeting were approved.

**Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Mike Joost- No report

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven- The January treasurer reports were distributed, LOLC, Community Center and Anderson Fund. It was noted that the General Fund donations for January were \$50K, which is \$21K over the amount budgeted. The walkway for the Community Center came in under budget, so a replacement for the window to the Kitchen in the Community Center and Handrails for the 3 outside walkways are being considered.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- The January report was distributed. It was mentioned that there was an annual gift given in its entirety in January for \$30K.

**Congregational Secretary:** Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties:** Barney Ross – no report

**Lay Ministry:** Joe Peeples- no report

**Christian Education:** Joshua Ringer- The Childrens Sunday School Schedule/work schedule will need to be reevaluated going forward. Joshua will be discussing this with Pastor Hayden via phone.

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Margaret Pedersen- Met with Pastor Hayden to discuss the state of our Service and Outreach programs. The Zoom Trivia night was a success. The February mission of the month, Care Baskets for Police and Fire in Putnam County, is getting help from the Tuesday Ladies Bible Study Group. The March Mission will be the same mission except for Greene County. The 2/16 blood drive has 49 of the 52 slots filled.

Linda Hayden and Kayleen Ringer have taken over responsibility for the Little Pantry. The coffee pot in the kitchen is being replaced.

**Pastor's Report:** Our Lenten season begin next week. Ash Wednesday is the only live service, all others will be online. The sign of the cross marking in ash will not be administered this year by the pastor due to the pandemic.

**Old Business:**

**1. Apartment Furnishings-** The items that were donated for the DCE apartment are being stored at the church and will need to find a home soon through donation.

**New Business:**



**Episcopal Church Rental Agreement-** The church has not met in person in our church since last March and have continued to pay rent. They are asking that we suspend their rent payments until they can return.

Mike made a motion and was seconded: **I move that we suspend rent payments, and welcome their return when they are prepared to, as well as refund the January 2021 payment already made.** The motion passed.

**Security Camera System for Church-** The current camera system which shows the doors and Pastor's office is only showing the front door now. Mike will investigate the system to see if he can bring it back to functionality. He will also investigate other alternatives.

**Sanctuary Lights to enhance video feeds-** Lights in the front to enhance the video feed have been bright and distracting to the Pastor. The addition of tissue paper has seemed to minimize the glare. We will continue with that solution for the near future.

**Replace AED (Automated External Defibrillator)-** The current AED has a recall notice. A 3<sup>rd</sup> party distributor is offering to replace the current AED with the same brand for \$700 with trade in. The council agreed for the Pastor to spend for this non-budgeted item.

**Vanco Electronic Payment System-** Allows for links to be used to provide donations to the church electronically. Pastor will work with Kathie to make this service available to the congregation.

The meeting was adjourned.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
