You've heard about Moses and Joshua, Abraham and Isaac, David and Jonathan. Have you ever heard about Bezalel and Oholiab? It's not even easy to pronounce their names, much less remember who they are. You can read about them in the book of Exodus.

You may remember that most of the book of Exodus is about how God used His servant Moses to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt; some two million of them. Now God gave them another task: the building of a tabernacle, the place where He would live and be with them. God Himself gave the instructions as to how the tabernacle was to be built. Those chapters in the latter part of Exodus may not be nail-biters, but they are proof that God cares how things are done and that He is a God of order and beauty. Moses had the directions, but God gives him something else as well. He gave him people with special talents to do each job. Two people God chose to work on the tabernacle were Bezalel and Oholiab: "See, I have chosen Bezalel...and I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with skill,

ability, and knowledge in all kinds of crafts...Moreover, I have appointed Oholiab...to help him. Also I have given skill to all the craftsmen to make everything I have commanded you" (Exodus 31:1-6)

Is it surprising that when there is work to be done, God gives his people the talents necessary to accomplish it? It shouldn't be! We have a God who cares even about the smallest details and decisions-and provides all that we need. Lake Oconee Lutheran has been charged with accomplishing God's will in our midst, in our community. There is work to be done, God's work, and it should not come as a surprise that God has given us special people with special talents to do each job. **He has given us you!**

God has given you talents! He has given you your interests and abilities to do His work. He has promised to equip you to use them for His glory in the building up of His people and in reaching out to those who don't yet know His Son. He just wants you to say yes and know that He will show you and help you to do whatever He puts before you. If you ask God to show you how, you can be His steward, like Bezalel and Oholiab were. Are you willing to trust His promise?

Would you be willing to serve on the Church Council as director of Education if God promised to help you? Would you be willing to serve as a Sunday School teacher if God promised to be with you and give you the strength and wisdom that you feel you would need? Would you say yes to serving as a worship assistant on the camera, an usher, reader, greeter or communion assistant if you knew that God would give you the skill necessary? To all of these and more, God gives us His YES. You may not feel as though you have the skill of Oholiab or the knowledge of Bezalel, but God has promised you that He will give you the skill, ability and knowledge that you need to accomplish His will, His charge to you in your life. When there is a task to be done, God is the One Who ensures that it will get done. We don't have to worry. All we have to do is answer positively if God taps us on our shoulders. Check out the opportunities available on the blue table or talk to our nominating committee of Mike Joost or Larry Davis for your opportunity to be a part of our service. Will you trust God's promise?

In his epistle, Paul shows them...and us...the way of error and the way of truth. His letter contains God's answers and counsel. Jeremiah offers women hope for living in an uncertain world by learning to navigate the challenges and circumstances of their lives. This six-week study examines God's words of instruction to His wayward people through the prophet Jeremiah, and provides women six guidelines for intentional living to overcome fear, worry, and doubt as they surrender their wills to God's and put their hope in Him alone. Women's Bible class meets every Tuesday @ 10 am in the choir room.

Operation Christmas Child 2022

Please continue to pray to God to prepare the hearts of children and their families to receive the Gospel and the Ministry Partners who are taking the 2021 shoebox gifts to children all over the world. Over 10.5 million shoeboxes were packed and donated worldwide in 2021. This number includes over 9.1 million boxes donated in the U.S. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church contributed 150 shoeboxes and received 415 shoeboxes during National Collection Week. LOLC's shoeboxes went to Burkina Faso, Republic of the Congo, Angola, and a "Hard-to-Reach" Area (difficult to access due to customs, cultural, or religious reasons). Thank you for your support and prayers.

We now prepare to begin our 2022 Operation Christmas Child (OCC) journey. OCC is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local Ministry Partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. The shoebox gifts are shipped outside the US to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease.

Our goal is to pack **150 boxes** for children ages 10 to 14 years old. We will be collecting items and donations of money starting in March and going through October focusing on groups of items needed each month. The items for each month will be outlined in an insert in our weekly church bulletin and email.

Overall, the items we will be collecting are:

We have tried to make it easy again this year for everyone to order these items by setting up an Amazon Wish List for Operation Christmas Child. All you need to do is click on the link provided each month, purchase your item(s) and they will be shipped directly to the church. Just like a gift registry, you will be able to see how many of each item was purchased and how many are still needed. Takes all the hard work out of shopping! You may also purchase these items in any of our local stores such as

Walmart, Dollar Tree, CVS, etc. and drop them off in the bins we will have available in the narthex.

SAVE THE DATES: We plan have a <u>Packing Party</u> to pack each box, like we did last year, as a team on **November 5th**. <u>National Collection Week</u> is **November 14 – 21**, **2022**.



"DON'T BE AFRAID"

On August 7, Pastor Hayden preached a wonderful sermon on not being afraid. This is something we should all think about as we pass the "blue table" in the narthex on our way into and out of church. Don't be afraid to sign up to volunteer for something.

I want to address, in particular, the Sunday morning fellowship time. We have heard that some of our members are afraid to sign up because they are intimidated by the goodies provided by some of our great cooks/bakers. It was suggested that instead of our normal goodies we simply place a standing order for donuts from Publix each week. We asked the members to offer their opinions to our church council members and elders and, boy, did you respond.

After careful consideration and discussion, the board of elders made a compromise recommendation to the church council and it was approved by the council. To lighten the demand on our members, beginning October 1, we will have store purchased treats on communion Sundays and continue to have the other goodies on the non-communion Sundays.

If you would like to help but you don't wish to prepare home-made goodies, simply sign up for a communion Sunday. For example, Wal-Mart has an excellent selection of boxed mini-donut varieties, cookies or coffee cakes. Six or so boxes, depending on the content, and a half-gallon of either apple or orange juice or lemonade and you are all set. Coffee is always prepared ahead of time and all cups, napkins and plates are provided. You don't even need to put the treats on plates — simply remove the lids and put a mini-tong in each box. What could be simpler? If you need financial assistance, simply give your receipt to Kathie Kueven and she will reimburse you from our kitchen fund up to a maximum of \$25 per Sunday. Of course, you may also sign up to work with one of those great bakers on a non-communion Sunday. Either way, we would ask you to continue to sign up so that we know a Sunday is covered. By signing up you will also be agreeing to pick up the treats, place them out, and clean up the fellowship table afterward.

Our fellowship time is a great opportunity to speak with those we don't see during the week and to welcome visitors and new members. We don't want this time to become so "routine" that people don't want to stay. Please consider carefully how you can help and sign up. God bless you for your service.
