John 6:8-9

I think of this story every time our congregation prepares its annual budget or looks for volunteers for another need. It's easy to compare the dollars hoped for to the expenses projected and see that there always seems to be a difference. It's easy to compare the work that could be done and the people who have volunteered to serve and see that there always seems to be a difference. It's then we worry that we won't be able to do everything that we had hoped for. It's then that I feel like speaking to God as Andrew did: "Lord, we have 'X' dollars or 'X' people, but what are they among so many needs?" Now we are looking forward to a new season facing new challenges. We will have new opportunities to teach, share the Word of God, worship together, to serve our community and those around us and do all the other things that are a part of our mission and ministry. Given the needs and opportunities that face us, it is more tempting than ever to think that we are too small, too few, too weak and ask, "Lord, here is what we can bring, but what are they among so many?"

Jesus' response to us is the same one He gave to Philip: "Give all you have and that will be enough." This is our Lord's word when we feel we don't have the resources to accomplish His will. It may show itself in a shortage of time, money, passion, or compassion, but Jesus always behaves as He did when He fed the 5,000. He tells us to bring our loaves and fish, our time and money, our hope and patience, our love and self-control. Then He blesses it and makes it enough. His blessing is the difference between famine and plenty.

God has never kept His power to Himself. He used it to create this world. He has used it to guide people to Himself through His prophets. He displayed it in a simple manger bringing the world to Himself. God takes what looks too small for the task, blesses it, and causes it to accomplish His will.

The four gospels all tell us about the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, but they don't all tell us about the same events. Even so, it's no coincidence that they all tell us about the feeding of the 5,000. Perhaps God knew that we would need a reminder, through this story, that we can give Him what we have and know that He will make it enough to accomplish His work.

Operation Christmas Child 2022

Please continue to pray to God to prepare the hearts of children and their families to receive the Gospel and the Ministry Partners who are taking the 2021 shoebox gifts to children all over the world. Over 10.5 million shoeboxes were packed and donated worldwide in 2021. This number includes over 9.1 million boxes donated in the U.S. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church contributed 150 shoeboxes and received 415 shoeboxes during National Collection Week. LOLC's shoeboxes went to Burkina Faso, Republic of the Congo, Angola, and a "Hard-to-Reach" Area (difficult to access due to customs, cultural, or religious reasons). Thank you for your support and prayers.

We now prepare to begin our 2022 Operation Christmas Child (OCC) journey. OCC is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local Ministry Partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. The shoebox gifts are shipped outside the US to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease.

Our goal is to pack **150 boxes** for children ages 10 to 14 years old. We will be collecting items and donations of money starting in March and going through October focusing on groups of items needed each month. The items for each month will be outlined in an insert in our weekly church bulletin and email.

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting

August 14, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, Pastor Hayden opened with a prayer.

Kathie Kueven, Barney Ross, Joe Peeples and Josh Ringer were not in attendance.

The minutes from the June 12th council meeting and July 10th Congregational meeting were approved.

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Mike Joost- Dave has set up the position statement for choir director and guest singers and has been posted at UGA. Pastor Hayden will be reaching out to a candidate who has expressed interest in the choir director position. It was noted that the new Choir Director position has fewer responsibilities and less time required compared to the of the previous Music Director position.

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven- Pastor Hayden distributed the three Treasurer's Reports for LOLC, Community Center and Anderson Fund. LOLC has spent \$4,828 more than receipts YTD. However, an extra \$25K mortgage payment has been previously made. The new Mortensen Memorial Fund was established with a deposit of \$150K.

Financial Secretary: Walter Krause-The June/July report was distributed and discussed. LOLC member donations are ahead by \$2,835 YTD.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

Church Properties: Barney Ross – Tom and Pastor Hayden discussed a proposal from Bughouse which covers wildlife exclusion in the attic for a 5-year period. This includes work to prevent entry and removal if wildlife gets in the attic. This has a one-time \$4,500 charge which covers the 5 years.

A motion was made by Mike, and seconded by Walter, "I move that we contract with Bughouse for wildlife exclusion for 5 years for a one-time charge of \$4,500. "The motion passed.

A roof leak has been identified and Barney is awaiting bids from Joes roofing and Als roofing.

Lay Ministry: Joe Peeples- no report

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer- no report

Christian Service/Outreach: Margaret Pedersen- The next blood drive is on September 15th. The Dinner Club is starting, schedules have been distributed.

This month Operation Christmas Child is collecting money to purchase items.

The next Sandwich Ministry is on August 28th, and 20 sandwiches are being requested per volunteer.

A request was made by a member to encourage the use of name tags. Pastor Hayden will bring this up at a future Sunday Worship service.

Pastor's Report: Steve Hayden- Pastor Hayden will be on vacation for 2 weeks for the 8/28 and 9/4 worship services.

Through our door offerings for Lake Oconee Youth Alliance, LOLC is helping support Ka'Niyah Robertson from Putnam County High School, to attend Paine College in Augusta, GA. She has received a \$2,000 scholarship in our name. She is an honors student, Beta Club member, track and softball athlete and will be majoring in Criminal Justice with a goal of being an FBI or GBI agent. A door offering will be initiated to continue the support at the 9/25 and 10/2 services.

An updated church/photo directory will de distributed in September.

Old Business:

1. Mortenson Memorial Fund Updates- No updates

Coffee Fellowship Update- It was discussed and agreed that beginning in October, Coffee Fellowship volunteers on Communion Sundays, will only provide store donuts. The volunteers for non-Communion Sundays will continue to provide other choices, including homemade items. Pastor Hayden will provide details of this to the congregation.

New Business:

1. New Pest Control Agreement- Discussed in Barney's report.

Roof repair/inspection-Discussed in Barney's report.

"DON'T BE AFRAID"

On August 7, Pastor Hayden preached a wonderful sermon on not being afraid. This is something we should all think about as we pass the "blue table" in the narthex on our way into and out of church. Don't be afraid to sign up to volunteer for something.

I want to address, in particular, the Sunday morning fellowship time. We have heard that some of our members are afraid to sign up because they are intimidated by the goodies provided by some of our great cooks/bakers. It was suggested that instead of our normal goodies we simply place a standing order for donuts from Publix each week. We asked the members to offer their opinions to our church council members and elders and, boy, did you respond.

After careful consideration and discussion, the board of elders made a compromise recommendation to the church council and it was approved by the council. To lighten the demand on our members, beginning October 1, we will have store purchased treats on communion Sundays and continue to have the other goodies on the non-communion Sundays.

If you would like to help but you don't wish to prepare home-made goodies, simply sign up for a communion Sunday. For example, Wal-Mart has an excellent selection of boxed mini-donut varieties, cookies or coffee cakes. Six or so boxes, depending on the content, and a half-gallon of either apple or orange juice or lemonade and you are all set. Coffee is always prepared ahead of time and all cups, napkins and plates are provided. You don't even need to put the treats on plates – simply remove the lids and put a mini-tong in each box. What could be simpler? If you need financial assistance, simply give your receipt to Kathie Kueven and she will reimburse you from our kitchen fund up to a maximum of \$25 per Sunday. Of course, you may also sign up to work with one of those great bakers on a non-communion Sunday. Either way, we would ask you to continue to sign up so that we know a Sunday is covered. By signing up you will also be agreeing to pick up the treats, place them out, and clean up the fellowship table afterward.

Our fellowship time is a great opportunity to speak with those we don't see during the week and to welcome visitors and new members. We don't want this time to become so "routine" that people don't want to stay. Please consider carefully how you can help and sign up. God bless you for your service.

The Board of Elders and the Church Council

<u>Lake Oconee Youth Alliance (LOYA)</u> Since 2017 LOYA has provided College Scholarship assistance to over 65 students who meet federal need qualifications and HOPE requirements. The average GPA of their scholarship students is 3.6 and as of 2022, over 10 scholarship recipients have graduated college.

Through your contributions, Lake Oconee Lutheran funded a scholarship last year for Ka'Niyah Robertson, a Putnam County high school honor graduate of 2022. Ms Robertson was active in softball, track and field and basketball. She served in FCA, volunteering with a food bank and assisting residents in nursing homes.
