Dear Friends in Christ,

Jesus, speaking to His disciples, says, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35).

"A new command." Yet it is an old one. It was Moses, way back in the book of Leviticus, directed by God to speak His commands to His people, who said "Do not seek revenge...but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord." (Leviticus 19:18)

Jesus amplified His command, however. We are to love, He said, "as I have loved you." How did Christ love us? At the time the disciples did not know the depth of Christ's love. They hadn't yet heard the story of the birth in Bethlehem announced by the angels. They had not yet been to Calvary and couldn't comprehend Jesus' references to His coming death. They had no idea that the Resurrection, Ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost were ahead.

We do have that knowledge. We have gathered together as God's people in His church to celebrate the love made flesh in the manger at Bethlehem. This month, in spirit through the internet, we will gather again in sorrow as we watch God die, not because of His actions, but because of our sins. But we will also come together with joy, hope and faith on our walk to the empty tomb at Easter. Now, we hear those words that were spoken to us, "Why do you look for the living among the dead. He is not here. He has risen!" (Luke 24:6)

We understand what Jesus is talking about for we know how He has loved us. He has loved us enough to leave the glories of Heaven. He has loved us more than earthly power and status and honor. He has loved us more than He loved His own life.

Jesus further said that love for one another would be the mark of members of the Family of God. Just as He gave sight to the blind, made the lame man walk, and healed the sick, so did His followers. Today it is just as important that we walk with Christ's love among those around us. With the love of Christ in us, we visit the lonely, provide food for the hungry, and share our financial resources in order that the Word of God might be preached and bring many others into God's family. Loving others as Christ has loved us means that we can be willing to give all things on their behalf.

Sinful beings that we are, we are not prone to love others as Christ has loved us on our own. The apostle John tells us how it is possible: "Dear Friends," he writes in 1 John 4:7, "let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God." We are born of God, and, by His grace, we can carry out His command to love one another through all the opportunities He gives us with all the gifts He gives us.

What does this look like in the time of Covid-19? It means phoning or checking on those around you to be sure that they are safe. It means shopping with the knowledge that others have needs as well, not hoarding what we find, but buying what we need and sharing the resource. It means asking others, especially those at risk, if there is something we could pick up for them. It means staying home so that we do not become the spread agent of more illness. It means kind words, strong patience, and prayer to God on behalf of others.

And may the love of God shown on Easter fill you with all peace, joy, and love for others.

### Mid-Week Bible Class

#### "Romans"

St. Paul's letter to the Romans is the first epistle in the New Testament because it is the longest, but it could also occupy that position because of its importance. It has always played an important role in the church because it summarizes so well the essential emphases of the apostle's theology. Throughout the letter Paul emphasizes that God's mercy comes to undeserving people who stand under the Law. In the Gospel of Jesus Christ, God freely gives righteousness through faith alone, not on the basis of their own accomplishments. This unconditional promise is the sole basis of people's relationship with God.

Martin Luther wrote, "This epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and it is truly the purest gospel. It is worthy not only that every Christian should know it word for word, by heart, but also that he should occupy himself with it every day...we can never read it or ponder over it too much."

WORSHIP DURING COVID-19: Lake Oconee Lutheran Church will be posting the weekly Wednesday night Lenten and Sunday Worship Services videos on our website (<a href="lakeoconeelutheran.org">lakeoconeelutheran.org</a>) and our Facebook page. The Wednesday service will always be available by Wednesday evening. We will be attempting to have the Sunday service online by Saturday evening, but it will be available no later than Monday morning.

As you have heard on the news, the White House and the Covid Task Force are now advising that the practice of social distancing be extended until April 30th for protection of ourselves and for the protection of others in our communities. The Church Council, in following the guidelines encouraged by State and National leaders, has determined that Lake Oconee Lutheran will not meet together, for worship or other purposes, in person but will continue on-line worship through the month of April. This will, of course, be subject to change depending on the direction of our medical leaders. This is disappointing for many of us who really desire to worship together, but we remember Christ's words, "Lo, I am with you always". Matthew 28:20. ### **Council Meeting Minutes – Sunday March 8 2020**

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Absent: Mike Joost, Barney Ross, Joshua Ringer, Laura Ringer

The minutes from the 2/16/20 Council Meeting were approved.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel: Mike Joost-** no report

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven-Presented the February financial documents. The old mortgage will be paid off from the LCEF funds. The new mortgage will be set up when we receive the final closing amount. \$3,650 has been received for debt reduction for the Harmony property. Donations are down by \$8,452 versus the YTD budget, expenses are down by \$9,989 vs the budget, showing a \$1,537 positive cash flow YTD.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause- LOLC is behind in giving YTD vs 2019, but that was due to an unusually large onetime gift given last January 2019. Also, a member notified Walter before the meeting that they would be providing a \$10,000 gift to be used to pay down the old mortgage, prior to paying it off.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties: Barney Ross (by Tom Mathson) -** Large lights in the front and back of the church have been replaced with LED lights. Tri-county EMC has been contacted to request lighting be added to the poles on the road that leads to the church. 8 new chairs have been received, which are similar, but not exactly like our current chairs. The current style is not available.

**Lay Ministry: Alan Oberdeck** - Barney Ross is looking into Audio/Video recording of Pastor's sermons to add to the website. The elder for April is Don Menke. Kent and Marlene Matson, and Grant and Louise Moore are joining the church. Pastor Kruger will be filling in for Pastor Hayden on 3/22, as he will be on vacation.

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer-no report

Christian Service/Outreach: Laura Ringer- no report

**Pastor's Report: Pastor Hayden** - Discussed the time and talent sheets for the council. Atlas Ministries would like to present to the congregation. It was decided to provide them time after an upcoming non-communion Sunday Service. Pastor Hayden will coordinate the date with them. On March 31<sup>st</sup>, the supervisor for the Intern program will be visiting the church and meeting with Pastor Hayden, and those associated with our program.

#### **Old Business:**

- 2. Music Director Search Committee update- No news
- 3. **Harmony property update-** The contract is at our attorney's office, working out any final details. Dr Ringer continues to represent LOLC with this project.

#### **New Business:**

 Harmony Building/Property Management- Tom Mathson will put together a committee of 3 or 5 members to discuss the management for the Harmony rental property acquisition. Alan and Kathie both volunteered to serve. Also, LOLC will begin advertising within the congregation for an individual who may be interested in managing the rental property. It was also discussed that sometime in the future, we will consider forming a group to study a site plan for the 2 new acquired properties.

The meeting was adjourned.
