# Dear Friends in Christ,

Romans 8:35-39 - Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, "For Your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Does this verse sound familiar? Perhaps because it was one of the Bible readings in church from the last Sunday in July and served as the text for the message So why talk about it again? Because it is a verse that we need to hear it again... and again. These days we've all had to experience some type of disconnect from people and places.

Whether it's a separation from the normal routines of our day or from friends and family, it's been an ordeal, to say the least. For many there's been the very difficult situation of being apart from loved ones who are sick. We've likely all seen the poignant images of individuals keeping their distance and looking in on a family member or friend through a window — so as not to potentially spread any disease or get it from someone else.

For believers, separation from others in the family of faith has its own difficulties, too. We draw special strength from gathering together in the Name of Jesus (see 1 Thessalonians 5:10-11; Hebrews 10:24-25; Colossians 3:16). In the *Apostles' Creed*, we speak of "the holy Christian church, the communion of saints," which gives us spiritual uplift and fellowship with one another. And you may have noticed in your own life how the recent suspension of church services or your inability to be there in person impacted your faith in some ways.

So at the very time when it seems as if this virus has come between us and our normal life, how good it is to know that there is nothing that can come between Jesus and us in His love. Whatever life brings our way — trials, persecution, a worldwide virus — we are secure in God's embracing and unchangeable love for His creatures. He has made that plainly known to us by sending His Son to save us from our sins. Jesus came specifically to *bridge* the distance that separated us from God. Having taken on our flesh and blood, **God entered our world for the sole purpose of bringing us back to Him** so that, never again, will we be separated from Him. God is for us!

As you continue to deal with the persistent threat of this virus, lay hold of the riches God has given to us. He has reconciled us to Himself (see 2 Corinthians 5:18); He has given us all things we need to live a godly life (see 2 Peter 1:3); and He promises to be with us always (see Hebrews 13:5). These are the things He has done for us, His children, people who can in no way be separated from the God who loves them, even now. After all, God is for us!

### A HISTORY OF COMMUNITY SERVICE CONTINUES

"Harmony Building News Release"



The Harmony Volunteer Fire Fighter's Association (HVFFA) was formed in 1983 as an auxiliary to the Harmony Fire Department. Its purpose was to raise money to support the volunteers and buy firefighting equipment. Events such as turkey shoots, cake raffles, fish fries, and much more, were used to support their efforts.

Shortly thereafter, the HVFFA membership constructed a multi-use Fire Department support building on the back of the property. For many years the facility was used to house fire department equipment, training, HVFFA meetings and community outreach. This is the building people have come to know as the Harmony Community Association meeting hall.

In 1996 Putnam County opened Station 3 at its present location on Old Phoenix Road and Putnam County began purchasing firefighting equipment and hiring professionals to operate the facility. As a result, the mission of the HVFFA evolved into support for local charities and a new organization was created – the Harmony Community Association (HCA).

For the past 25 years the HCA membership has gathered each month for a fellowship dinner and to organize fund raising for local charities. Beneficiaries have included Putnam Christian Outreach, Circle of Love, Oconee Regional Humane Society, Phoenix Homemakers Secret Santa Program, scholarships for exceptional area students and aid to many other local charitable organizations.

The Harmony Community Association Mission Statement:

"The Harmony Community Association is made up of local area residents who want to make the community a safer, cleaner, better place to live by community involvement and support of local charities". In 2019 the membership agreed the HCA needed to consider ways to expand the scope of our charitable program and a number of ideas were discussed. One idea was to offer the HCA building for sale, with 100% of the proceeds being used to fund charities. The only drawbacks were the potential loss of a meeting place for the HCA and denying the general public a reasonable rental option for community events.

It was decided to approach our neighbor, the Lake Oconee Lutheran Church, to determine if there was interest in acquiring the HCA property. Thankfully, and with heartfelt appreciation to the Lutheran Church, an agreement was reached benefitting the Church, the HCA and local charities.



Earlier this year the Lake Oconee Lutheran Church acquired the HCA Community Center and continues to offer the facility for family friendly community events. In addition, the Church is allowing the HCA to continue using the meeting hall for our meetings.

The new message on the sign says it all, "Built for a Purpose".

### Council Meeting Minutes – Tuesday July 21 2020 [Meeting held via ZOOM]

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Walter Krause and Barney Ross were not in attendance.

The minutes from the 6/16/20 Council Meeting were approved.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel: Mike Joost-** The analysis is complete of the current state of WIFI and computers/software in the church. Recommendations will be provided in new business.

**Treasurer: Kathie Kueven**- Presented the June report for LOLC as well as the Community Center. The Community Center brought in \$1200 in rental income, with costs of \$1965. Many costs were one time startup costs. LOLC showed a positive cash flow of \$15,914 for the month. LOLC has a positive cash flow of \$42,916 for the year.

A motion was made by Alan and seconded by Larry:

"I move to transfer \$75,000 from the Bank South Operating account to the LCEF account for the purpose of earning interest." The motion passed.

**Financial Secretary: Walter Krause**- There were no questions regarding the June written report. It was noted that receipts are up YTD by \$41,442 over 2019.

#### Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

**Church Properties: Barney Ross** – Tom had spoken to Barney and passed on the following: The sprinkler system has been shut off, due to a water leak that he has not been able to be locate yet. A water bill from Piedmont water was received for \$857 for the month which is much higher than normal. It was suggested to have Barney contact Piedmont Water to ask for a reduction in the bill.

The HVAC system drains were plugged and were opened by technicians and the excess water drained.

#### Lay Ministry: Alan Oberdeck- No report

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer- No report

**Christian Service/Outreach: Laura Ringer**- We will be replacing the Bloomfield Coffee pot that is no longer working.

**DCE**: **Katherine Lutz**- The mission for the month, "Little Free Pantry Restock", is going well. In August we will be partnering with the local schools in Greene and Putnam Counties, details announced on Sunday, 7/26. Also working on a Women's Bible Study program. Tom announced to Katherine that the Church would be using our Scholarship budget fund to provide \$1,000 per semester for her next school year.

**Pastor's Report: Pastor Hayden**- The live video feed of the services is going well with improvement in the technical presentation. Katherine has been helpful in handling the technical side of the Live video service. We will continue our live services in the same fashion for the next month, as we continue in phase 1 return.

#### **Old Business:**

1. **Community Center-** Tom discussed that the rentals for the Community Center are going well, and additional rentals are on the books. The new door decals have been installed. Special thanks to Terry Pedersen for his work in acquiring the signage and coordinating the rental calendar and moving tables. Small repair/improvement projects are ongoing. The former owners, Harmony Community Association, wrote an article in the Eatonton Messenger announcing the sale of the property to LOLC. That article will be posted in the newsletter.

#### **New Business:**

**1. Computer System Upgrade-** Mike Joost presented the recommendation for the upgrade to the computers and software and new WIFI in the sanctuary. This upgrade could be completed in 4-5 weeks. A motion was made by Kathie and seconded by Alan:

**"I move to follow the recommendations and authorize the purchase of one new laptop, 3 monitors, 2 Office 365 software programs and the Wi-Fi upgrade described, with the cost being approximately \$2200."** The motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned. Pastor Hayden closed with a prayer
