Dear Friends,

Our daughter Kate got married last fall and now she and her husband are looking for a house to purchase. Our son Christian has proposed to his longtime girlfriend, and they are in the midst of planning a wedding. Several loved members of our congregation have passed away this year leaving "holes", not only in our chairs and in our lives, but also in the lives of their families. For each of them (us), this is a time of transition: Something has ended, while something new is just beginning or has not yet begun. I know that we all are feeling some of the same things I feel when my life is in transition: excitement, anxiety, fear and confusion. But we can also experience something else in these life changes—they offer us unique opportunities to grow closer to God. Meeting God in our lives is nothing new. Most of us have learned to expect to find God in our daily routines, our predictable activities and our special occasions. What we don't always remember is that God is with us in the messy stuff, too, like career changes, household moves, shifting patterns in family life and relationships, future planning and even death.

In the Old Testament, Moses was biding his time, shepherding the flocks of his father-in-law, when God invited him to make a job change. Several books later, Samuel was training for temple service when he received a literal wake-up call from the Lord. On the morning of the Resurrection, Mary Magdalene was steeped in grief when she arrived at Jesus' tomb. And in Acts, a driven Saul was suddenly brought up short (or rather, knocked to the ground) on the threshold of his dramatic conversion into the man we know as St. Paul. They all remind us that sometimes, the prayer we need most is one for courage.

"Do not be afraid," the angel tells Mary Magdalene and Mary as they look into the empty tomb on the morning of Jesus' resurrection. They respond in the same way most of us do when we are faced with something that rocks us loose from the comfortable, safe moorings of our familiar world: They are afraid.

In the conclusion to Matthew's Gospel, the two Mary's leave the tomb to announce the Resurrection to the other disciples. On the way, Jesus meets them and reminds them once more, "Do not be afraid" (28:10).

Our congregation is in a transition. The proposal to expand the ministry into Milledgeville has been accepted and new tasks, new experiences, new demands will soon come upon us. It would be

natural for us to experience excitement, anxiety, fear and confusion. But the promise remains: this can also offer us unique opportunities to grow closer to God. Transitions are inevitable in our lives. They are also natural. Our challenge as faith-filled Christians is to see God's saving presence in every moment and even perhaps especially in the trying periods of change.

Opportunities to Serve

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry

The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.

We do this in two separate ways:

1. <u>The Bread of Life Food Pantry provides equitable access to food and staples twice per</u> month to those in need in the community.

2. <u>The Little Free Pantry provides emergency food for community members who might</u> have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both of these important ministries.

- For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support this ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution and limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth Wednesday and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution or distribute the food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies.
