Dear Friends in Christ,

When we think of the Christmas story, we usually think of a little stable in Bethlehem with a child lying in the manger. We think of shepherds in the fields gazing with jawdropping amazement at the sight of angels filling the sky praising and glorifying God. We think of Magi bringing in royal gifts and bowing before the child speaking of a star they have followed. Sometimes we forget that the Christmas story really begins months earlier in a small Galilean village called Nazareth when an angel named Gabriel appeared to a young, unmarried girl and told her that she was pregnant, and not just with any child but with the Son of God!

"How can this be" Mary stutters and stammers in response, "since I am a virgin?" Then Gabriel speaks one of the most amazing and wonderful lines in the entire Christmas story—and one of the most overlooked. *"For nothing is impossible with God."* (Luke 1:37).

"Nothing is impossible with God!" Think of what this means. It is not some seasonal wish of snowflakes and Happy Holidays which melts away at the first sign of heat. It is a promise and guarantee that changes our lives year around.

"Nothing is impossible with God!" Think of what this means. No matter how dark the night or how impossible the situation seems, we can have hope. Our church, worrying about its future or the mission in Milledgeville, you may be worrying about your health or about your family, we are all wondering what next year will look like. We can have hope!

"Nothing is impossible with God!" If God chooses to intervene in our lives, nothing will stop that intervention. God formed the world by a word. God parted the Red Sea. Jesus turned water into wine and healed the blind, the lame, and the sick. The Spirit empowered Peter and the disciples to speak up for God and brings comfort to those in pain.

We have limitations. God does not! *"Nothing is impossible with God!"* This knowledge and confidence is a Christmas gift that lasts all year long.

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry

The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.

We do this in two separate ways:

1. <u>The Bread of Life Food Pantry</u> provides equitable access to food and staples twice per month to those in need in the community.

2. <u>The Little Free Pantry provides emergency food for community members who</u> might have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both important ministries.

- For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support this ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution and limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth Wednesday and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution or distribute the food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies.

As always, we thank you so much for the wondrous gifts you provide for both important ministries.
