#### Dear Friends,

Everywhere, at this time of year, we notice that Christmas is near. The decorations, the bells, the carols all give evidence that the Christmas celebration is already in full swing. But are we celebrating Christmas shallow or Christmas deep?

Too often Americans observe a shallow Christmas complete with tinsel, glitter, holly and ivy, gift buying in crowded stores, Christmas music and, oh yes, silver bells. But these externals, fine in themselves, frequently leave little time for a deep reflection on the true meaning of Christmas.

There by the manger in the still of the night we find Mary looking in wonder at the newborn Christ Child and the visiting shepherds from the fields of Bethlehem. Luke writes, "But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart". Luke 2:19.

Mary is celebrating a deep Christmas. Already reflecting for nine months on the visit of the angel and the growing new life within her, she continues to focus on the meaning of this birth for the world. She knows the Savior is born from her womb.

Mary, not Scrooge nor the Grinch, is the model for our celebration of Christmas deep. We can enjoy the sights and sounds of the season along with family and friends. But we also take time to kneel at the manger and worship the Christ Child who is to die on the cross for our sins. By the Spirit's

power, as we worship together during Advent, we treasure up all these things and ponder them in our hearts.

Not Christmas shallow, but Christmas deep.

# **LOLC offers Bible Study**



#### Women's Bible Study

**The Women's Bible Study** is meeting in the Council or meeting room around the big table with informal sessions and open discussion about the Bible and its impact on our everyday lives.

The Women's Bible group is in a study of the book of Proverbs. *The Way of Wisdom* considers principles on everyday topics like words, work, friendship, marriage, parenting, neighborliness, money management, leadership influence, and more. We will discover the wisdom of Proverbs as an invitation to steadily walk God's way in God's world. Please plan on joining us on Tuesdays at 10:00 am in the church conference room for the study and the wonderful discussions we always have about how what we learn impacts our lives.

#### **Sunday Morning Bible class**

The Reformation has had an enormous influence on every area of life—on religion, politics, education, family life, and the world of work. Most of this was unintentional, at least on a human level, and both good and evil came of it. Yet God was doing His work, bringing thousands and, ultimately, billions of people to the knowledge of their Savior Jesus Christ and to saving faith in Him.

Join us on Sunday morning Bible study and we will examine the effects of the Lutheran Reformation—what consequences it had and how it continues to grow today.

Join us for each Sunday morning at 9 am in the church. This class will also be livestreamed on Facebook and our website.

#### **Mid-Week Bible Class**

Martin Luther once identified three things that make a good theologian: prayer for the Holy Spirit to understand God's Word; meditation on this Word; and, as the "touchstone," enduring afflictions; afflictions not even though we are Christians, but afflictions because we are Christians.

Luther noticed a discrepancy in his day: On the one hand, Scripture is filled with passages about the necessary suffering of the saints in the world as they follow their crucified Lord in church, home, work, and state. On the other hand, the teaching and practice of many seemed to be about avoiding this God-sent cross at all costs.

Today being "religious" is widely seen as a path to freedom from pain and suffering. Scripture holds out a different vision, where we are shaped by the cross of Christ.

Join us for <u>"Cross, Suffering with Jesus"</u> each Wednesday morning at 10:30am on Zoom.

# **Opportunities to Serve**

#### **Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry**

The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.

We do this in two separate ways:

- 1. <u>The Bread of Life Food Pantry</u> provides equitable access to food and staples twice per month to those in need in the community.
- 2. <u>The Little Free Pantry provides emergency food for community members who</u> might have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both important ministries.

- For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support this
  ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution and
  limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth Wednesday
  and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution or distribute the
  food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you
  provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in
  supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by
  checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies.

As always, we thank you so much for the wondrous gifts you provide for both important ministries.

#### Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Annual Voters Meeting November 16, 2025

The meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Mike Joost called the meeting to order.

Carol Campbell – Secretary – Carol Campbell read the meeting minutes from the voters' meetings of September 21, 2025, and November 11, 2024. The minutes were approved as read.

Pam Kunz – Vice President – Pam informed the congregation that planning for the church's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary is underway for the first Saturday in February 2026. She asked that people provide her names and contact information of any founding and former members. She also asked for any photographs that people might want to share.

Kathie Kueven – Treasurer – Absent – The October's Treasurer report and the 2026 budget were distributed to the congregation. Pastor Steve explained that our expenses have exceeded our income by \$23,000 year-to-date although all our bank balances are positive. The Community Center is up \$1,700 for the year. The Anderson fund had no withdrawals for 2025, and the balance is \$132,500 and the Bread of Life continues to thrive. We are feeding approximately 70 families twice per month. We've had volunteers to meet those needs, and our bank balance has increased from the initial donation.

Walter Krause – Financial Secretary – No report.

Margaret Pederson – Christian Education – No report.

Mark Dentler - Church Properties - No report.

Don Menke – Lay Ministry – Don recognized the Elders' team for their work with the congregation and mentioned that their pictures were displayed on the bulletin board.

Kayleen Ringer – Christian Outreach – We have reached our goal for Operation Christmas Child and are gearing up for the advent soup suppers.

Pastor Steve – Thanksgiving service is on November 26 at 7:00 pm. The next week advent services begin. Weds., December 3<sup>rd</sup> will be our evening advent service with soup supper at 6:00 pm and church service at 7:00 pm. On December 10 we will have a daytime service with lunch at noon and church service at 1:00. December 17, we have an evening service with soup supper at 6:00 and church service at 7:00. Christmas Eve, Weds., Dec. 24, we will have services at 7:00 pm and on Christmas Day, Thurs., Dec. 25, we will have service at 10:00 am which includes communion. Pastor thanked Cheri and Matt Kitchens for taking the congregations' pictures for the directory. We will be publishing a new directory in January. Old Business:

Milledgeville - Pastor Steve reminded the congregation that we have signed the lease with Oconee Valley Health Care and Oconee Valley has also signed the lease. Dave Ringer has met with the contractor and finalized the remodeling plans. Once he receives the final estimate, they will move forward with financing. We will have some type of open house/groundbreaking ceremony that all can attend. In January, Lake Oconee Lutheran will be putting together a call committee to find a church worker who can work in Milledgeville. At this point, we don't know whether we will call a pastor or DCE. Our goal is to find the right person rather than a title. The finances for the new position are not in the 2026 budget. We will initially fund it through the Anderson Fund until those funds are depleted. The call committee will narrow the field down to a few people so the congregation can decide who we call. New Business:

2026 Budget – Pastor Steve reviewed the 2026 budget in Kathie's absence. Income and expenses are up \$13,116 from 2025 which is primarily due to salary increases. The council has worked to keep the budget as low as possible. The only question was about the decrease in mission expenses. Pastor explained that the mission expenses were still based on 10% of actual income rather than budgeted income. A motion was made and seconded to approve the 2026 budget. The motion was passed. Election of Officers – Pam Kunz reviewed the following slate of officers:

Mike asked for any floor nominations, and none were made. The slate of Council Members and Board of Elders were approved by the congregation.

Christmas Tree Decorating – A new pre-lit Christmas tree was ordered. Mike Joost asked that someone arrange to be at the church to receive the new tree since he will not be available. Decorating the church for Christmas is scheduled for Saturday, December 6 at 9:00 am.

The meeting was adjourned and Pastor closed with prayer.
