The Old Testament Lesson: Nehemiah 1:1-9 Reader: Peggy Uehlin

R: 1 The words of Nehemiah the son of Hacaliah. Now it happened in the month of Chisley, in the twentieth year, as I was in Susa the capital, ² that Hanani, one of my brothers, came with certain men from Judah. And I asked them concerning the Jews who escaped, who had survived the exile, and concerning Jerusalem. 3 And they said to me, "The remnant there in the province who had survived the exile is in great trouble and shame. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates are destroyed by fire." 4 As soon as I heard these words I sat down and wept and mourned for days, and I continued fasting and praying before the God of heaven. 5 And I said, "O Lord God of heaven, the great and awesome God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, ⁶ let your ear be attentive and your eyes open, to hear the prayer of your servant that I now pray before you day and night for the people of Israel your servants, confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against you. Even I and my father's house have sinned. ⁷ We have acted very corruptly against you and have not kept the commandments, the statutes, and the rules that you commanded your servant Moses. 8 Remember the word that you commanded your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the peoples, 9 but if you return to me and keep my commandments and do them, though your outcasts are in the uttermost parts of heaven, from there I will gather them and bring them to the place that I have chosen, to make my name dwell there.'

The Epistle Lesson: 2 Peter 3:8-14 Reader: Peggy Uehlin

R: ⁸ But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. ¹⁰ But the

day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed.

¹¹ Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, ¹² waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn! ¹³ But according to his promise we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.


¹⁴ Therefore, beloved, since you are waiting for these, be diligent to be found by him without spot or blemish, and at peace.

mortgage for the purchase. Lake Oconee Lutheran is planning on using the facility as a base for community outreach, to further our mission of being a "Family of Spirit filled Servants". We believe that this additional land will not just increase our physical footprint in terms of lot size, but that God will use it to increase His spiritual presence and footprint on our community. The window behind the altar is our EASTER SUNRISE WINDOW.

The cross hanging in front of the window is an empty cross, reminding us that Jesus rose from the dead and is alive now to be with us here and always. Every Sunday is a celebration of Easter. The symbol on the front of the ALTAR is a combination of two Greek letters: the "chi," which looks like our English "x," and the "rho," which looks like our "p." In the Greek, these letters are the first two of "Christ." Combined as they are, they suggest the cross. Superimposed on the cross is a heart, the reminder that God's love for us is the reason Jesus died on the cross. God's love for us empowers us to share his love with others.



Chapter 21

The Story: Rebuilding the Walls "The Story" Chapter 21; Malachi 3:6-17

Please use this space to take notes during the message today.

"On the day when I act," says the Lord Almighty, "they will be my treasured possession. I will spare them, just as a father has compassion and spares his son who serves him. Malachi 3:17

Adult and teen small group discussion points

- 1. What's the most extensive remodeling or construction project you have been involved in?
- 2. Ezra was "well versed" and "learned" (pp. 291-292) in God's Word. Share with your group who has been your most influential Bible teacher and why.
- 3. Ezra had devoted himself to studying God's Word and following what it teaches (Ezra 7:1-10; "The Story," pp. 291-292). How did Ezra's commitment to God's Word shape his life and ministry? Why is it so important that we do more than just know the content of the Bible but actually obey what it teaches?
- 4. God worked through King Artaxerxes to send the exiles back to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple and reestablish worship (Ezra 7:11-28; "The Story," pp. 293-294). How have you seen God use surprising people and circumstances to accomplish his will in this world?
- 5. Nehemiah was a man of prayer (Nehemiah 1,4,6; "The Story," pp. 294-299). What situations led Nehemiah to pray and what do we learn from his example?
- 6. Nehemiah's enemies tried to use the false prophet Shemaiah to distract him from the rebuilding project. How do you determine if a message is from God or another source?
- 7. Malachi was the last prophet of the Old Testament. He challenged the people to give God their first and best, not their last and leftovers (Mal. 1:6-10, 3:6-12; "The Story," pp. 302-304). What are some ways we give God our leftovers rather than our first and best?
- 8. The prophet Malachi was sent to correct the priests and the people (p. 301- 303). What were they doing that dishonored God?
- 9. When the people of God heard the Word of God read, and had it explained, they moved into action. In this case, they reestablished the Feast of Tabernacles. Tell of a time you read the Bible or heard a message that you were moved to action because of what God taught you.

Close in prayer.

Family's with kids discussion points

Please use these discussion questions with your children.

Key verse: Don't be afraid of your enemies. Remember the Lord. He is great and powerful.—Nehemiah 4:141.

- 1. When the walls around Jerusalem were completed, the people celebrated. Ezra read God's law to them from sunrise to noon (Nehemiah 8:3). Why do you think he did that?
- 2. What's the longest you've ever been in church? What did you do?
- 3. After Ezra spoke, the people went away and celebrated with great joy, because they now understood God's Word. Why did they react this way?
- 4. Do you think knowing God's Word better, would help you (like it did for the people in Ezra's time?) How can you learn God's Word?

Family Activity: When Nehemiah learned that God's people were in great trouble and disgraced, he wept. He didn't want God's people to suffer. He wanted them to be safe and protected.

Sit down with your family and brainstorm ideas on what you could do to make God's people safer in your area. You could:

Extend a hand to a friend in trouble

Find a project to work on at school, church or in your neighborhood

There are tons of other ideas. Concentrate on ideas that will keep God's people safe, and then ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to make these ideas a reality. You may need to include another family from church or the whole congregation.

Dream big. Nehemiah did, and God helped him accomplish his goal quickly.

Pray together: Lord, help us to remember that you are on our side, and that you proved it by sending Jesus to die and rise for us. Fill us with your Spirit, and lead us to your Word. Amen.
