**D**ear Friends,

On Sunday mornings our Adult Bible class has been Exploring the Old Testament. The study of the Old Testament is nothing less than an exploration into the thoughts and desires of God for ordinary people like you and me. It takes us from this hardened and selfish world into the promise of a world where God's peace, justice, and mercy will be complete.

It is easy to view the world as meaningless and without hope. But Jesus Christ came to rescue the world from its quagmire, and His deliverance continues to change our lives.

So, I would like to continue in that theme through our Lenten Wednesday worship. Most of us know that Jesus is the King of kings. But there are other kings we read about in the Scriptures. The Books of Chronicles are focused on the kings from the line of David. The goal of Chronicles is to illustrate, through the kings of Judah, the rule of the coming King—the Christ, who will sit on the throne of his father David forever. In other words, we see put the kingdom of Christ into clearer focus through the lens of the good kings (mostly) of Judah as they are portrayed in the Chronicles. Join us as we learn how each king is a shadow of the one true King, Jesus Christ. He is the fulfillment of the promise, which each king was unable to realize.

Join us on Wednesdays every Wednesday during Lent for **Chronicles of the King** and our Lenten worship and meals.

Please be aware that there is a charge to the church for each gift received in this way. **(If you include your name on the form (screen) when it asks, the gift will show up on your church statement, but we are unable to do that if you do not input your name).** You may also request a receipt sent to you if desired.

### **Sandwich Ministry**

**The Sandwich Ministry of Stone Mountain** at Rock of Ages Lutheran Church, a suburban church supporting an urban ministry, is currently seeking volunteers for our next delivery on **February 15, 2026**. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church invites all members to **sign up now** to help provide meals for this urban community.

#### **Preparation Requirements:**

- **Assembly:** Each sandwich should consist of one slice of cheese and one slice of meat (turkey, ham, bologna, or roast beef).
- **No Condiments:** Do not add mayo or mustard, as sandwiches must stay fresh for up to six days.
- **Individual Packaging:** Place each sandwich in a sealed plastic bag and clearly label it with the type of meat.
- **Bulk Labeling:** Group individual sandwiches into a larger bag and write the **preparation date** on the outside.

#### **How to Support:**

- **Quantities:** One loaf of square sandwich bread typically yields 10 sandwiches.
- **Donations Needed:** We need additional coolers for transport.
- **Volunteer Opportunity:** We are seeking a ride-along volunteer to assist

with the February 15 delivery.

## **Opportunities to Serve**

### **Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry**

**The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.**

We do this in two separate ways:

1. The Bread of Life Food Pantry provides equitable access to food and staples twice per month to those in need in the community.
2. The Little Free Pantry provides emergency food for community members who might have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both important ministries.

- For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support this ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution and limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth Wednesday and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution or distribute the food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies.

As always, we thank you so much for the wondrous gifts you provide for both important ministries.

Council Meeting  
January 11, 2026**

The meeting was called to order by President Mike Joost. Pastor Steve led us in prayer. Margaret Pedersen was absent and all other members were in attendance. The minutes from the December 12, 2025, council meeting were approved.

**Council Committee Reports:**

**VP/Personnel:** Pam Kunz – No report.

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven – The December Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Year-to-date income was up \$87,065 due to a strong December while year-to-date expenses were \$20,154 higher than budget for a year-to-date budget surplus of \$66,911. A prayer of thanksgiving was given by Pastor Steve. Pastor Steve pointed out that \$15,000 from the 2025 Evangelism budget should have been transferred to the Milledgeville ministry. This was not done. Pastor asked for a motion to move \$50,000 of the year-to-date surplus, which includes the \$15,000 from the budget, to the Milledgeville Ministry account. This was tabled until after Mike Joost gave an update later in the meeting.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause – The financial reports for December were distributed and discussed. Year-to-date December donations were up \$34,351 due to higher member gifts. Total Other contributions were down \$5,866 due to the difference in Bread of Life and Milledgeville contributions which were \$66,745 in 2024 versus \$22,000 in 2025.

**Congregation Secretary:** Carol Campbell – No report.

**Christian Education:** Margaret Pedersen – Absent. No report.

**Church Properties:** Mark Dentler – We put new bulbs in the outdoor sign. A group of volunteers took down the Christmas decorations. Mike, Barney and Mark met with Chris Adams from Fortis Site Works who is doing the sewer line from the new subdivision to Highway 44. They want to use a six-foot easement from the church property (running alongside the entry street in the vacant lot of trees opposite Sherwin Williams) to run the water and sewer line and need our approval to do so. No trees need to be removed to do this and there will be no cost to the church. In exchange for this easement, we have asked Fortis to help us with the community center connection to the water and sewer line. A motion was made, seconded and approved to allow Fortis to run a water and sewer line along Thunder Road to Highway 44 using a six-foot easement from the church.

**Lay Ministry:** Don Menke – No report.

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Kayleen Ringer – We will provide easter baskets for those children in foster care again this year. The blood drive did not reach its goal this month. We had 34 donations this month.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Hayden – Pastor will be on vacation February 1-13. Pastor Artelt will fill in on the two Sundays he is gone. Lent starts on February 18, and we will be organizing soup suppers for Lenten services. Pastor also thanked all who helped in Christmas services and in the decorating and undecorating of the church.

**Old Business:**

**Milledgeville Update:** Dr. Ringer has worked with the contractor to finalize the costs for the renovation and will be moving forward to seek financing.

**Carol Dunn Estate** – Mike Joost received the financial bequest information from the Carol Dunn estate. The estate bequeathed stock and equity in many companies to the church. Mike will call the financial advisor who set up our new equity account to determine how best to move forward with either liquidating or holding on to the equity. A motion was made, seconded and approved to move \$50,000 from the 2025 operating budget surplus to the Milledgeville ministry account as discussed under the

Treasurer's Report.

**LOLC 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** – Pam is still working on plans for the luncheon to be held on February 21. We will have an event at 12 noon, which will include a small thanksgiving devotional service, a meal, and time to see the memorabilia and pictures from our congregational history.


**New Business:**
