Dear Friends in Christ,

Every year we celebrate Pentecost 50 days after Easter. This year that date was June 8th. But we don't always understand it. Pentecost seems to be a strange story, with the crowded room, the rushing wind, the tongues of fire, people from many nations hearing the disciples speak in their native languages. No wonder that it is hard to know what Pentecost means to us today. Christmas, you know why it is important. Easter, yes, its significance is obvious. But Pentecost??

Jesus' words give meaning to the event: "You will be My witnesses" (Acts 1:8). Since Jesus will soon ascend into heaven, He intends for the apostles to proclaim the Good News in word and deed. They are to bear witness to the ends of the earth. Challenging doesn't begin to describe the task Jesus gives them. No wonder that the disciples stand there at His ascension confused, weak, afraid—wavering in their witness.

But this same purpose of Pentecost remains for us, this is what Pentecost means for us today as well. We are His witnesses in our own homes, next door, at work, in our community, and throughout the world. What a task! Does it seem overwhelming? You bet! And we hesitate, rationalize, stumble, fear—wavering in our witness.

It is for that reason God makes available to us the power of Pentecost. The disciples were afraid, uneducated, sinful but the Holy Spirit transforms them into unashamed

witnesses who cannot but speak of the things that they have heard and seen—in the temple, before the council, in the synagogues. It was Pentecost power in the Word of God.

Wavering in our witness today, we too receive God's Pentecost power in His Word. We too are given the strength to speak of what we have seen and heard—in our neighborhood, in the grocery stores, at the doctor's office, on the golf courses and pickleball courts, wherever we come into contact with people. Peter points us to the crucified and risen One, Jesus Christ on that first Pentecost. And he shows us what happens when we too receive the power from on high to be His witnesses today. Through Jesus' life, death and resurrection we are forgiven our sins and we receive the Spirit of Pentecost. We cannot help but speak and live the things that we have heard and seen through God's Word.

Pentecost is our story after all!



Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting

June 8, 2025

The meeting was called to order by President Mike Joost. Pastor Steve led us in prayer.

Kathie Kueven and Walter Krause were absent, and all other members were in attendance.

The minutes from the May 18, 2025, council meeting was approved.

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Pam Kunz – No report.

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven – The May Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Although income was down significantly expenses are still under budget. Year-to-date income was down over \$34,000. Kathie asked Council to think about the budgeting process for 2026 and where we can cut expenses.

Financial Secretary: Walter Krause – There was a \$30 difference between Kathie's report and Walter's due to a \$30 credit card donation. The financial report for May was distributed and discussed. May activity was down over \$13,000 and year-to-date down over \$23,000.

Congregation Secretary: Carol Campbell – No report. **Christian Education:** Margaret Pedersen – No report.

Church Properties: Mark Dentler – Absent – Kathie Kueven reported that the facilities workday was successful. A lot of work was completed from the original checklist. They tore down all the play equipment, cleaned the ovens and refrigerators and reorganized the cabinets.

Lay Ministry: Don Menke – Ed is the elder this month followed by Don and Barney.

Christian Service/Outreach: Kayleen Ringer – Absent - Margaret reported that Bread of Life received \$6,200 from Del Webb's 100 Who Care.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Hayden – Pastor and Dave Ringer attended the 35th annual Florida Georgia District Convention last week. President Harrison attended and gave an update on the state of the synod. We also received an update on the district and that they turned over Milledgeville to us. There was a sense of harmony and sharing of the Word of God. Elections were held and President Rocky was reelected for a second term. The District is involved in disaster relief, youth and schools and how they help congregations and missions. There will be another President's Equip conference in Orlando September 2026 for church workers and any interested congregation member. More information will follow. They held an ingathering for donations to the Lutheran Church in Uganda. We donated hymnals, bibles, altar paraments, and vestments. We had over eight boxes of donations. A grant was received to pay for the shipment of items to Uganda.

Our new church secretary is doing well and after the 120-day probationary period we will increase her salary if her performance warrants.

Old Business:

Milledgeville – We cleaned out the property and will continue sorting through it. The lawyer now has the new lease agreement and is in the process of reviewing it. It is a 20 year lease. At the end of 20 years, we will need to renegotiate the lease. We will lease the building for a nominal amount to Oconee Valley Health Care, and they will take out a tenant mortgage to pay for the entire building. They will also pay for the upkeep and utilities. There will be no cost to Lake Oconee Lutheran, and they will have full access to the non-medical portions of the building. Once the lease is finished, it will come to the council, and we will set up a voter's meeting. Oconee Valley is hoping to be in early 2026. We will have a ministry coach come in from the District to work with Pastor and the Milledgeville Committee. We will then need to organize a call committee to call either a pastor or DCE to the site. The Anderson Fund will cover a portion of that expense, but when the funds are depleted LOC will need to cover the costs. We will need to budget this in the fall. It will take a while to call someone given the shortage of pastors if we decide a pastor is needed. The call will be from and by Lake Oconee Lutheran and the Milledgeville site will be considered a second location for the church.

Carol Dunn Estate – Mike has not been able to determine whether a stock account exists, so he is setting up a new broker account. Once it is set up, we should notify the congregation that it is available if they wish to donate stock. He will continue to explore whether another account exists.

Milledgeville Clear Out Date –We were able to donate quite a few items to the low-income housing behind the Milledgeville

site. We have a date set to move out chairs, desks and other items in June which will be announced. It should take about $\frac{1}{2}$ day.

New Business:

None

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.

Opportunities to Serve

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry

The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.

We do this in two separate ways:

- 1. <u>The Bread of Life Food Pantry</u> provides equitable access to food and staples twice per month to those in need in the community.
- 2. <u>The Little Free Pantry provides emergency food for community members who</u> might have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both important ministries.

- For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support
 this ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution
 and limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth
 Wednesday and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution
 or distribute the food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you
 provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in
 supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by
 checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies. As always, we thank you so much for the wondrous gifts you provide for both important ministries.
