Dear Friends in Christ,

In the early formation of our nation George Washington had the opportunity to become king of the burgeoning nation. But given the young nation's experience with England and because he had a robust prayer life he knew there was only one King, so he declined the offer.

The people of the land apparently knew the same. "In a 1774 report to King George, the Governor of Boston noted: "If you ask an American, who is his master? He will tell you he has none, nor any governor but Jesus Christ." The pre-war Colonial Committees of Correspondence soon made this the American motto: "No King but King Jesus."

The story of God's chosen people might have gone very differently had they chanted the same motto. Instead, they wanted a king. Over the period of the kingdoms of Israel and Judah there were thirty-eight kings. Only five of them were good. Of the others a refrain heard throughout the Old Testament goes like this: "They did evil in the eyes of the Lord."

Prophets appeared exhorting the people to turn back to God. God spoke through one prophet—Isaiah—to tell the people of Judah that they would be captured and deported to Babylon but afterward he would bring them back home. The purpose? "Then you will know that I am the Lord; those who hope in me will not be disappointed. Then the whole human race will know that I, the Lord, am your Savior, your Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob" (Isaiah 49:23).

In Isaiah 53 the prophet depicts the coming Messiah. The description doesn't sound like a king even to us today. "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by others, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain" (Isaiah 53: 2, 3). God did not want the people to miss him. But they did. And often still do.

Our nation would have gone a much different route had Washington agreed to be king. But he seemed to know what many others didn't. When we displace God on the throne of our lives, the outcome will go horribly wrong. But when God is on the throne in our lives, when we recognize "No King but King Jesus" then we are in the best possible position for godly success.

Maybe our American ancestors knew the best way to start a revolution. Adopt the motto "No King but King Jesus" in your life. See what changes that ignites in your life!

This unconditional promise is the sole basis of people's relationship with God.

Martin Luther wrote, "This epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and it is truly the purest gospel. It is worthy not only that every Christian should know it word for word, by heart, but also that he should occupy himself with it every day...we can never read it or ponder over it too much."

Council Meeting Minutes – Sunday January 19 2020

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Mike Joost was not in attendance.

The minutes from the 1/12/20 Congregational Meeting were approved.

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Mike Joost- no report

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven- LOLC showed a loss of \$5,885 for the year, which was attributed to paying for the unbudgeted sound system in 2019. The current mortgage balance for the church is \$101,768. The detailed fiscal 2019 report was distributed to the council, without discussion.

Financial Secretary: Walter Krause- Member donations for 2019 was \$308,742, which is an increase over 2018 of \$52,276. When Memorials, Debt Reduction and other categories are considered, 2019 total was \$374,568, an increase of \$60,753 over 2018. The increase was attributed to more members and more giving per members. The Mortensen donation will be categorized under "other" for 2020.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

Church Properties: Barney Ross- Outdoor overhead lights are replaced due to vandalism, from bb guns. Continuing to search for replacement bulbs for our current 250-watt light fixtures inside the church. The 400-watt steeple light fixture needs a new ballast which will cost \$62. Yellowstone Landscaping is providing a quote to replace the bushes in the front. They have also offered to thin the new property purchased for \$50 per hour. It was suggested to get an idea of the amount of time that it would require. A door repair technician has been contacted to assess and repair all the outside doors. An electrician suggested that outdoor lights set in the church eaves could project light in the evening into the parking lot and walkways.

Lay Ministry: Alan Oberdeck- A handout was distributed with all details. Pastor Hayden will be attending the Circuit Convocation in Savanah on 2/2-5, followed by vacation. Reverend David Kruger will be leading the service on 2/9. Kathie Kueven is the Elder in charge for February. Ash Wednesday is February 26th. Soup Supper at 6:00 on March 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th, and April 1st. Service will follow at 7:00 PM on those days. Maundy Thursday, 4/9, and Good Friday, 4/10 will have service at 7:00 PM. "The Passion of Christ" Movie will be shown at the Church at 1:00 PM on Good Friday. Easter Service is at 10:30 on April 12th. There was discussion regarding having a breakfast prior to church.

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer- Reviewing the current materials that we have on hand for our new Children's Sunday School Program. If needed, we will purchase new materials. Proposed time for the new children's program would be from 10:00-10:30 on Sunday. It will be announced at the January 26th service that we are looking for volunteers for the program.

Christian Service/Outreach: Laura Ringer- Will take charge of setting up the Easter breakfast, and there will be no adult Bible School on Easter Sunday.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Hayden- The DCE Intern application has been submitted for an intern from the Concordia-Chicago program. Pastor Hayden has had success and familiarity with the Chicago program. There will be a visit from the head of the program to LOLC prior to the decision. The decision is expected by the end of April. If LOLC is chosen, Pastor Hayden will meet with the intern in Chicago in May. An estimated cost of the program for the year was distributed by Pastor Hayden, the total cost is \$39,600 for the year.

Old Business:

- 1. DCE Intern Update- This was discussed by Pastor Hayden in the Pastor's Report.
- 2. Music Director Search Committee Update- No new candidates identified.
- 3. Video System for services- No new update
- 4. Church Lights- Discussed fully in the Properties report

New Business:

1. Harmony Community Association building offer and congregational proposal-Kathie Kueven presented the research done from the financial aspect and provided handouts. LOLC would not need to pay any property tax for the Harmony property. There are many options for a mortgage with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund. The rate is currently 4.5% which can change quarterly. The current mortgage could be rolled into the new loan, with no down payment needed. Another option is that the church has enough in savings to pay off the current mortgage of \$101,768. It was estimated that depending on the option, that our current monthly payment would be similar to our current monthly payment. Rental income for 2019 was \$11,522, and the cost to maintain the property was \$7,090. There was discussion that Silver Moon has expressed interest in purchasing some of the property from LOLC following the purchase. The council was not interested in that idea. It was discussed that the Harmony Community Association Building will provide more room for church activities and a location for our new proposed outreach/community service activities. It was also discussed that the property would provide more exposure to Hwy 44 traffic to the church. A motion was made by Alan to purchase the property and seconded by Laura. It passed by voice vote. A document titled "Recommendation of the Board of Directors LOLC" was signed/initialed by the board. This document, as well as, supporting documents from the meeting will be presented at the congregational meeting on 1/26/20, for a vote by the congregation to purchase the property. An email to the congregation, announcing the congregational meeting will be sent out on 1/20/20.

The meeting was adjourned.

Pastor Hayden led the Lord's Prayer.

UPDATE on Harmony Community Association land purchase

On Sunday, January 26, 2020 Lake Oconee Lutheran Church, during a congregational meeting, voted to purchase the Harmony Community Association land and building that borders GA 44 and our east parking lot for \$349,000. We will be applying for a mortgage for the purchase.

Lake Oconee Lutheran is planning on using the facility as a base for community outreach, to further our mission of being a "Family of Spirit filled Servants". We believe that this additional land will not just increase our physical footprint in terms of lot size, but that God will use it to increase His spiritual presence and footprint on our community.

On the memo line please write Harmony land purchase. Any special gifts received will go to decreasing our mortgage.
