# Dear Friends in Christ,

Have you ever thought how amazing it is that the accounts of Jesus' life in the Gospels do not end with the telling of the Easter story? If this were a movie, or perhaps a novel, the story would end with the great climatic moment when Jesus comes out of the tomb and appears to his disciples, both men and women. That kind of ending is what makes good drama, a good story. What could possibly make a better ending?

Matthew, however, ends his Gospel with these verses:

<sup>16</sup> Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. <sup>17</sup> When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (*Matthew* 28:16-20) Wow! While Christ's resurrection marks the completion of God's plan of salvation for you and me, it turns out that Christ's resurrection is not the end of the story, not the end of God's involvement in our lives. Now that you have heard the Good News, now that you have experienced My love and power in all its glory, God says, I want you to go and share the message with those around you. And He promises to give us the opportunity.

And He does give us that opportunity right now! In some ways, our current situation ought to sound familiar to our ears. On Easter Sunday, the disciples were in the upper room with the door locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus, in His resurrection appearances, tells them to come out of that "safe" mentality and go out sharing His love. At the beginning of this year, we too often looked for the comfortable safety of a room to seemingly wait for Jesus. What happens? We are sent out of that safe mentality and sent out to share His love. Time after time we have been provided the opportunity by God to be His spokesmen, to show His love and care to others, not by sitting in our comfortable spots, but by loving and serving those around us.

Easter Day may be over for another year, but God's story at Lake Oconee Lutheran doesn't end. We exist, the Gospels tell us, not to sit around waiting for the Lord to come to us, but to be the church in action, to be the church in witness, to be the church in love, to look for ways we can live out the rest of God's story in our lives today, and tomorrow.

### LOLC WORSHIP UPDATE

When the Church Council last met to discuss whether to discontinue "live" or in person worship, the motion authorized the discontinuation of public worship to the end of April. As that time approached, the council met through email to discuss whether or not to extend that hiatus. We noted that several things that were important to our discussion.

 Governor Kemp's executive order still standing in the State of Georgia declares a State of emergency and bans all non-profits from "gatherings of persons" until May 13, 2020.

- Georgia (despite Gov. Kemp's reopening order) still has not met the guidelines necessary to move into phase 1 of Pres. Trump's "Opening Up America Again" plan. The federal plan requires 14 days of declining numbers in new infections and deaths from COVID-19 for a state's entrance into Phase 1 of recovering. However Georgia, according to the CDC, still is experiencing increases in both cases of Covid-19 and deaths as of April 27th.
- Upon communication with our sister, circuit congregations, we learned that none are planning to resume meeting in person until May 31st or early June in accordance with health concerns within our state.
- Many in our membership fall into the "at-risk" category due to health concerns.

Having reviewed all of these points, the Church Council voted to continue our practice of distance worship and Bible study through May 30, 2020 to be reviewed at that time based on then current trends. We will not meet in person but will continue to post worship opportunities online through the various platforms. This still leaves open the possibility of our first public worship being May 31st, Pentecost Sunday.

Worship will continue to be posted on Facebook, YouTube and on our website at <u>www.lakeoconeelutheran.org</u>. Please "follow" our Facebook page or "subscribe" to our YouTube channel to receive notifications when new content is published. You may visit the website at any time. We will also continue keeping our members informed through Constant Contact and offering Wednesday Bible Class through Zoom. [Watch for the Email with the link each week and join us.]

Finally please contact Pastor Steve if you have special needs or questions. Thank you.

**YOUR CHURCH CONTRIBUTIONS**: A time like this can truly hurt our congregation financially. ### Council Meeting Minutes – Sunday April 14 2020 [Meeting held via ZOOM]

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Walter Krause was not in attendance.

The minutes from the 3/8/20 Council Meeting were approved.

#### **Council Committee Reports:**

#### VP/Personnel: Mike Joost - no report

**Treasurer: Kathie Kueven** - Presented the March and YTD financials. LOLC has a \$56,899 positive cash flow for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter ending on March 30<sup>th</sup>. This was aided by two large donations provided the last week of March totaling \$42K. The LOLC Community Center checking account was established and will be listed with the other bank balances going forward on the treasurer's report. The church building mortgage was paid off. There is \$18,802 remaining in the LCEF account.

A motion was made by Barney and seconded to take \$7,364.38 from the operating fund and move it to the LCEF fund, which is what our April and May mortgage payments would have been. The motion was approved.

**Financial Secretary: Walter Krause - (presented by Tom Mathson)** A donation of \$10K was received for debt reduction on the Church mortgage, which has now been totally paid off.

#### Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis - no report

**Church Properties: Barney Ross (by Tom Mathson) -** The 2 acres that were recently purchased has been 95% cleared of brush, the remainder will be completed when the ground dries. The front door repair has been completed. Barney is looking into an irrigation system.

**Lay Ministry: Alan Oberdeck** - The Elders have reached out to the congregation and there is not anyone with COVID-19. He had heard feedback that some in the congregation hope that the sermons online will continue after the pandemic.

#### Christian Education: Joshua Ringer - no report

#### Christian Service/Outreach: Laura Ringer - no report

**Pastor's Report: Pastor Hayden** - The Lenten Services were successfully provided online due to the shelter in place order. A new Wednesday evening Reading and Devotion will be provided on Facebook live on Wednesday evenings beginning on 3/15 during the current separation period. Also Bible Classes via Zoom will be provided on Wednesday morning from 10:30-11:15, beginning on 3/15. Dick Braun has passed away, and Marge will be moving to Oklahoma.

#### **Old Business:**

- 1. Harmony building purchase The purchase will be completed on May 18<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. Music Director Search Committee update No news
- 3. **Harmony building rental committee formation -** LOLC Harmony Management Committee was formed. It consists of the following members: Robin Peeples, Susan Larson, Terry Pedersen, Tom and Sandy Mathson, Kathie Kueven, Alan Oberdeck.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Video System Purchase A motion was made by Larry and seconded to authorize the Pastor to spend up to \$3K to purchase a video system to capture church services. The motion was approved.
- DCE Intern Housing A motion was made by Laura and seconded to authorize Pastor Hayden to commit to the 2 bedroom apartment discussed, behind "Sweet Kneads". The motion was approved. Our new intern is planning on arriving around June 1<sup>st</sup>. Pastor is sending out an email to the congregation stating any furniture/household needs that she may have.
- 3. **Staff continuation during our current Shelter in Place Mandate -** Our church secretary continues to work from home. Our cleaning lady continues to clean the church. Lev is continuing to be compensated.

The meeting was adjourned.

Notes: Debt reduction incime of \$3,650 received on Harmony purchase less \$195.56 expenses (for rental refund and check purchase) was transferred to new Harmony accounty. One time donation of \$10,000 to reduct mortgage payoff was deposited in LCEF account as mortgage had already been paid off when it was received. Quarterly LCMS expense to district, \$10m803 0,803.88 was made on April 2 and will be reflected next month It should be noted, however, that this was \$2,591.88 over budgeted amount, thanks to very generous donations during March. Other expenses includes transfer of funds to Harmony account (\$3,454.44) and \$2,951.03 for additional sound system equipment as well as the regular March mortgage payment.
