Dear Friends in Christ,

In the beginning...Once upon a time...It was a dark and stormy night...

Each of our stories has a unique beginning. My story started differently than yours, and yours began differently than everyone else's. But regardless of how our stories began, each of us lives out the story of our life every day.

If you're like me, you don't stop very often to think about "the story of my life." You're too busy living it! But if someone asked you to tell your story, what would you say?

You might start with where you were born and how you were raised. You might describe your favorite teacher, your first crush, your first car. You might include that time you scored the winning touchdown or that other time you threw up right before singing your first solo. If you're married, you might describe how you met your spouse. If you're a parent, you might

scroll through some photos on your phone or tablet and show off your family.

Sure, you haven't been perfect or lived a flawless life, but who has? You've made your share of mistakes. (We all have.) Some decisions you got right, and others... well, let's just say they're not as easy to discuss. Chances are you might have some chapters in your story you'd rather not share with anyone.

Reflection may give you a clearer understanding about which things in your life you can change and which things you can't. And this prayerful reflection can become a guide to making wise and God-honoring decisions as you move forward. But no matter how you describe your story, there's good news. Your story is not over.

Lent and Easter remind us that God has changed our story for us. God, through His grace in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, has redeemed you, reclaimed you as His own, and created a new life in you by the Holy Spirit. You have been re-born to live as His child. Paul writes to us in Romans chapter 6, 5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

6 We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7 For one who has died has been set free from sin.

8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9 We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. 10 For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. 11 So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Your story has taken a turn. My story has taken a turn. We are now new born children of God and that is a story worth sharing. Join us during our Lenten services as we share that story again.

### Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting February 9, 2025

The meeting was called to order by President Mike Joost followed by a prayer by Pastor Hayden.

All members were present.

The minutes from January 12, 2025, council meeting was approved.

### **Council Committee Reports:**

VP/Personnel: Pam Kunz - No report.

**Treasurer:** Kathie Kueven – Kathie reviewed the January Treasurer's Report. Expenses were over budget due to the Pastor's fourth quarter payroll taxes being paid and transfers from donations to the Bread of Life.

**Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause - The financial report for January was distributed and discussed. Walter noted that donations for January show a decrease of \$24,705 from last year due to an annual donation made last year in the amount of \$35,000 offset by a 2025 donation of \$8,000. Other donations were up \$2,030 due to donations to Bread of Life, Little Free Pantry and the Christmas shoebox ministry.

Congregation Secretary: Carol Campbell - None.

Christian Education: Vacant - None.

Church Properties: Mark Dentler – Bug House came out and removed a squirrel from the church attic. Mark plans on a facilities work day on March 1 at 9:00 am. He plans to hold a workday quarterly. He installed an automatic closer on the women's bathroom stall and is going to have someone come out and look at the sprinkler system. There appears to be a leak in the system and we have not been able to find it. Mark will follow-up on that. The facilities committee now consists of 7 to 8 volunteers. The back doorbell is failing and we have ordered a new one.

**Lay Ministry:** Don Menke – We are in the process of updating the Elders' list to ensure all new members are included.

**Christian Service/Outreach:** Kayleen Ringer – There will be a funeral on Saturday, February 15 where we will provide coffee and record the service. There is a sign-up sheet for Lenten soup suppers. There will be a sign-up for Easter brunch and we will continue with the Easter baskets for foster children this year. We had 39 donations for the blood drive with 13 deferrals.

Pastor's Report: There will be a funeral for Pam Kunz's sister-in-law on Saturday, February 15. Pastor will be gone on vacation the beginning of March. Pastor Ochner will fill in on Sunday, March 2 and Ash Wednesday, March 5. Dr. Artelt will be here on March 9 and 16. The March 12 service at noon is open and pastor will have a lay person lead that service. Pastor will return on March 17. We are alternating Wednesday services between evening and lunch until Holy Week. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will be evening services without meals.

We have one Sunday School teacher for several Sundays and we are looking for one more. The circuit pastors will be at our church for their regular meeting on Thursday, February 20. Kayleen will provide snacks and coffee.

### **Old Business:**

Milledgeville – We are still waiting for the builder to provide pricing which will be used to take to the congregation for approval of a mortgage. We will hold an open house prior to any changes being made to the building. The committee will get together and then we will hold a special voters' meeting to approve an application for a mortgage. The mortgage will pay for the renovation costs and the monthly payments will then be paid for from the medical practice rent. We will then put together a call committee to call a church worker for the location.

### **New Business:**

Choir Risers – The Lake Country Chorus has asked if they can rebuild the choir risers to make them lighter and more stackable. It was agreed that they could rebuild the risers, but they will need to store them rather than storing them at the church. If they do not want to store the risers, we will donate them to anyone else who might want them.

**Christian Education Position** – Bob Elkins has agreed he can no longer serve in this position. Pam and Pastor will be working on appointing someone for this position for the balance of this year. The position will be on the ballot for election next term by the congregation.

Organist – Dave Heimer announced that he will be reducing the number of Sundays he will play organ. Dave does know several organists and we will have him approach them to see whether they would be willing to play at the church and how much it will cost. We could have the organists play on the Sunday's Dave doesn't play to try them out.

Lutheran Social Services Budget Cuts – A question was raised about the accusation in the media by a few people associated with the federal government that Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services was laundering federal grant money and that aid should be stopped. This has been strongly denied by the organization and they have pointed out the fact that they have been legally approved by the government for services provided and that they are actually providing the services agreed upon. The supporting Lutheran Synods also deny any criminal or wasteful practices by the service organizations. Here is a portion of President Harrison's (LCMS President) statement.

First, though I do not agree philosophically with every operational aspect of LIRS, if there is something legally amiss, the blame falls squarely upon the federal government. LIRS — and even our own LCMS RSOs — simply does what the government asks and pays for them to do.

During his first term, President Trump and the First Lady visited one of the LCMS RSOs currently under scrutiny. The president wanted to ensure that the institution would be a place to deliver outstanding care to unaccompanied minors. That agency has been quietly doing this work since that visit. They take the work with profound seriousness and love. They did not and do not deserve the broad brush of disdain brought upon them.

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.

# **Opportunities to Serve**

### **Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry**

The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.

We do this in two separate ways:

- 1. <u>The Bread of Life Food Pantry</u> provides equitable access to food and staples twice per month to those in need in the community.
- 2. <u>The Little Free Pantry provides emergency food for community members who</u> might have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both important ministries.

- For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support
  this ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution
  and limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth
  Wednesday and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution
  or distribute the food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you
  provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in
  supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by
  checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies. As always, we thank you so much for the wondrous gifts you provide for both important ministries.
