Dear Friends,

During our worship services in November, Lake Oconee Lutheran will be having a stewardship emphasis titled, <u>Faithful Participants in God's Mission</u>. God gives us the privilege and responsibility to be participants in His mission "to seek and save the lost" (Luke 19:10). Our heavenly Father does not want anyone to "perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). As the Apostle Paul wrote, God "desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4), and He wants us to be active, involved, and willing participants in His plan of salvation for all people. As participants with the Lord, we become His hands, feet, and mouth through whom He works.

In order to be <u>Faithful Participants in God's Mission</u>, we need the help of the Holy Spirit Who takes from us our hearts of stone and gives us our hearts of flesh (Ezekiel 36:26). With these new hearts, we can begin to understand how much God loves us and all people. Through faith, we know that He sent His Son to suffer and die on the cross for our redemption, which prompts us to respond to His love by committing our time, talents, and money to His service. We live lives with a new perspective, meaning, and purpose. Because of God's saving activity, we willingly surrender our lives and become

participants in Jesus' mission to share the life-saving Gospel with all people.

To help us understand what it means to be <u>Faithful Participants in God's Mission</u>, we are focusing on these weekly themes:

<u>Week One: "We Are Ambassadors for Christ"</u> In his letter to the church in Corinth, Paul wrote, "Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making His appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20).

Week Two: "We Are God's Fellow Workers" In 1 Corinthians 3:9 we read, "For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building."

Week Three: "We Are to Be Generous and Ready to Share" In Paul's letter to Timothy, he wrote, "They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share" (1 Timothy 6:18).

During this time, we will also fill out our annual pledge forms for 2026 and our Time and Talent pledges.

May God bless you as you continue the faithful stewardship of all that He entrusts to you.

This way you can personalize your shoeboxes and encourage family and friends to participate with you. Include your family, neighbors, pickleball or tennis team, craft group, or co-workers. Celebrate your birthday, anniversary, or other special event by packing a shoebox with your family or friends. Remember, school supplies go on sale in July! Drop off your filled shoebox gifts **throughout the year at the church before November 9.**

Another option that you may find more convenient is to **build a shoebox online.** Shoebox gifts built online go to the ends of the earth to children in some of the hardest-to-reach places. Online boxes are carefully prepared and sent by OCC, abiding by strict customs regulations to safeguard partners who will deliver the gifts, as well as the boys and girls who receive them. Sandwich Ministry: Support for Rock of Ages Lutheran Church

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church is once again partnering with the Sandwich Ministry of Stone Mountain Rock of Ages Lutheran Church. This ministry serves the urban community by providing much-needed sandwiches, and our church is helping with the next delivery scheduled for **November 16th**.

How You Can Help

A signup sheet has been posted for volunteers. Each person who signs up is asked to bring prepared sandwiches to church by November 16th. These sandwiches will then be delivered to Rock of Ages Lutheran Church after the service.

Sandwich Preparation Guidelines

- Each sandwich should contain one slice of cheese and one slice of meat. The options for meat are turkey, ham, bologna, or roast beef.
- Do not add any condiments, as sandwiches may be served for up to six days.
- Pack each sandwich individually in a sealed plastic bag. Clearly write the type of meat on each bag.
- Place the smaller bags into a larger bag and write the preparation date on the larger bag.

• One loaf of square sandwich bread makes ten sandwiches.

Additional Needs

- We need more coolers to transport the sandwiches.
- A volunteer is needed to ride along and assist with the delivery on November 16th.

The more volunteers who participate, the fewer sandwiches each individual will need to prepare. If you have any questions, please contact Kathie Kueven.

Opportunities to Serve

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Food Ministry

The goal of The Bread of Life Food Pantry and the Little Free Pantry is to respond to the needs of our community through food distribution and support by sharing God's love in Word and action with those most in need.

We do this in two separate ways:

- 1. <u>The Bread of Life Food Pantry</u> provides equitable access to food and staples twice per month to those in need in the community.
- 2. <u>The Little Free Pantry</u> provides emergency food for community members who might have run out of food and have no other means in which to feed themselves or their family.

We also have two different mechanisms by which LOLC members can provide either their time or their donations to help us sustain both important ministries.

For the Bread of Life Food Pantry cash donations are the best way to support this
ministry. We need a certain number of specific items for each distribution and
limited storage. You can volunteer your time on the second and fourth Wednesday

- and Thursdays of the month to either set up the food distribution or distribute the food to those in need.
- For the Little Free Pantry, food and/or cash donations are needed. The food you
 provide goes directly into the pantry and any cash you provide is used to fill in
 supplies where we might be running short. You can volunteer your time by
 checking on the cabinet and filling it up when food supplies run low.

Volunteers may sign up for either or both pantries by signing the sheets provided on the blue table in the narthex.

Because the Little Free Pantry is to be used to fill in what is needed on an emergency basis, we thought it would be helpful to provide a shopping list for those who choose to donate food and a daily distribution list for those who fill up the Little Free Pantry. You will find a handy guide to help you with these important tasks posted on the doors where we keep the Pantry food. Please limit food donations to the items on this list. It can help you when you shop for the pantry or when you fill the pantry with supplies.

As always, we thank you so much for the wondrous gifts you provide for both important ministries.

Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting October 12, 2025

The meeting was called to order by President Mike Joost. Pastor Steve led us in prayer.

Don Menke was absent, and all other members were in attendance.

The minutes from the September 21, 2025, council meeting were approved.

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Pam Kunz – No report.

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven – The September Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Year-to-date offerings were \$46,288 less than budget while year-to-date expenses were \$29,375 less than budget for a year-to-date difference of \$16,913. Mission expenses were not paid at the end of September but will be paid in October. Pastor's expenses were up due to the payment of a quarterly tax deposit. We have a total of \$733,731 in our bank balances. The community center has taken in \$14,542 in rental income year-to-date while expenses have totaled \$11,794 for the same period. There is \$12,884 in the community center bank account. Kathie also provided copies of the budget comparison between 2025 and 2026. **Financial Secretary:** Walter Krause – The financial report for September was distributed and discussed. The report covered one week in August and four weeks in September so it would align with the Treasurer's report. September of 2024 had five Sundays as well. There was a \$300 discrepancy from the treasurer's report due to credit card transactions for missions. There was a \$23,000 difference in other donations as the Davis Mortensen life insurance payment was received in 2024.

Congregation Secretary: Carol Campbell – No report. **Christian Education:** Margaret Pedersen – No report.

Church Properties: Mark Dentler – There was a workday in Milledgeville on October 4 where several people helped complete the clean out of Hope Lutheran church. The remaining furniture is being stored at Mark's facility in Athens. The pressure washing of the church has been completed and the damaged panels replaced. Barney has volunteered to pressure wash the memorial garden and a quote was obtained to pressure wash the siding and second story windows. Weed control was applied to the front of the church and in the islands. Mark met with Piedmont Water about the water bill from the leak we had. As expected, they did not accept responsibility for damage repair or the excessive water usage so we will need to pay the bill. Rather than buy a filter for the water fountain, Mark will reset the timer. We had an electrical outlet problem that Pastor Steve resolved, and another faulty outlet will be replaced next week. We need a new flapper in the women's restroom which Mark will fix. The Bread of Life volunteers took care of moving the tables and chairs in and out for the Upscale Resale sale. Mark obtained a quote for outside janitorial services which came to \$15,600 annually. We will continue to use Sonya to clean the church as the budget for her services is \$8,600 per year.

Sonya listed her cleaning duties for Mark, and he will put together a job description based on what she provided.

Lay Ministry: Don Menke – Absent. Kathie reported that several new members have been assigned an elder

Christian Service/Outreach: Kayleen Ringer – We have money in the Operation Christmas Child fund and we will purchase boxes with those funds. We should meet our goal without any problem.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Hayden – The piano in the conference room was donated. Tomorrow Pastor is driving to Savannah to pick up socks from Bombas. We are receiving 1000 pairs to distribute. He talked with the lay ministry and in January we will form a call committee for the position in Milledgeville. We have received a few volunteers already. In November we will have a stewardship theme for three weeks and we will also have a voters meeting.

Old Business:

Milledgeville Update: We have everything out of the building that we wanted to save. The lease has been signed by both parties. Oconee Valley will get in touch with the builder to solidify the plans and estimate. We are currently paying the utility bill and bill for the yard, but once Oconee Valley secures the loan and takes possession, they will be responsible for the bills.

Carol Dunn Estate – We do have a donation of securities that will be placed into the brokerage account we set up. Once the securities have been sold, we will report the income to Walter.

LOLC 25th Anniversary – Pam is going to put an item in the next bulletin about the anniversary, and she is thinking about a theme for the event. She came up with service, blessings, obedience and opportunity. She will be asking for pictures and contact information for former members. We will make a copy of the original charter. We will hold the event on February 7 and will have a potluck dinner with the main dish being provided by the church.

Congregational Voters Meeting – The meeting is scheduled for November 16 and will also be our council meeting. We will submit the budget and have election of officers.

New Business:

Election of Officers – Margaret Pedersen has agreed to serve as the head of Christian Education for the next term.

Reminders:

We will have the church barbeque on November 1 and in January we will start a call committee. We will have advent soup suppers on Wednesday in December. The 3^{rd} and 17^{th} will be the evening services, and the 10^{th} will be at noon.
