Dear Friends in Christ,

A while ago, I watched the movie <u>Somm</u> on some streaming service. <u>Somm</u> is a documentary about a group of men trying to attain the level of Master Sommelier — the highest level an expert in wines can achieve. Six wines, unlabeled, were placed in front of the aspiring contestants. They would swirl the glass, immerse their noses completely inside, and take a deep breath. Then they would take a sip, swish the wine in their mouths, and spit it out in a bucket. From this exercise, they had to be able to declare the region, variety, date, body, and tannins of the wine. It was an entirely different world than what I have experienced. I found the descriptions of the flavor to be the most fascinating. The word most often used was hint. A candidate would say, for example, "This wine has a hint of cinnamon, a hint of oak, a hint of licorice, a hint of blueberry, and a hint of earth."

I am also picking up hints of hope and humility."

That is living like Jesus. And living like Jesus is absolutely the best way to live — now and forever.

Mission of the Month

Why are we talking about Christmas already you may ask? Well, we want to make you aware of this year's campaign for Operation Christmas Child. Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. They ship these simple gifts outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to children living on Native American reservations in the U.S.

Our goal this year is to pack **150 boxes**, up from the 100 boxes we packed last year. We will be collecting items and donations of money starting in May and going through October focusing on groups of items needed each month. The items for each month will be outlined in an insert in our weekly church bulletin.

Overall, the items we will be collecting are for boys and girls aged 5-9:

Stuffed Animals Comb Washcloth Lip balm (non-liquid) Small pencil sharpener Safety (blunt tip) scissors Sunglasses Yo-yo Harmonica or woodwind recorder Toothbrush Bar Soap Colored pencils Small notebooks Glue stick (no liquid glue) Stickers

All you need to do is click on the link listed below, purchase your item(s) and they will be shipped directly to the church. Lake Oconee Lutheran Church Council Meeting August 8th, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Mathson, followed by an opening prayer by Pastor Hayden.

Joshua Ringer and Barney Ross were not in attendance.

The minutes from the July 9 Council Meeting and the July 25 Congregational meeting were approved.

Council Committee Reports:

VP/Personnel: Mike Joost- No Report

Treasurer: Kathie Kueven- The three Treasurer's Reports were distributed and discussed. LOLC has a positive cash flow of \$18,815 YTD. The Community Center has a positive cash flow of \$3,263 YTD.

Financial Secretary: Walter Krause- The July Financial report was distributed and discussed. The YTD member donations are behind through July by \$28,172. It is primarily due to large full- year donations being given in early 2020.

Congregational Secretary: Larry Davis- no report

Church Properties: Barney Ross – No Report

Lay Ministry: Joe Peeples- Pastor Ron will be guest Pastor on 8/22, and Pastor Dehnke will be guest Pastor on 8/29. Pastor Hayden will be on vacation.

Christian Education: Joshua Ringer- no report

Christian Service/Outreach: Margaret Pedersen- A BBQ/Potluck lunch will be provided on Sunday October 3rd. The BBQ will be provided by our new member Jay McCrae. An inperson trivia event is being considered after review of the calendar.

Pastor's Report: Steve Hayden- Jackie Bircher has joined the church. A paragraph will be provided in an upcoming newsletter with information about our new members. The church office is working on a new updated Directory to be completed in September. Bible Classes continue with good feedback and attendance.

Old Business:

1. Security Camera System for Church (internal)- The new security camera systems are expected to be installed by late September.

2. Reduced Restrictions on Communion- The Pastor and assistants will continue to mask and glove for communion. The Pastor will also announce that individual Communion kits are still available for members to take Communion at their seat location.

New Business:

1. Musical Leader Internship Opportunity- Mike has been in contact with Lev regarding the possibility of employing a Choir Leader intern from the Georgia College. Also discussed was the possibility of employing up to 4 music students to sing in the choir.

Kathie made a motion and was seconded. **"I move that Mike should continue to pursue a Music/Choir Director intern and up to 4 singers from Georgia College. We authorize \$75 per week plus mileage for the Director, and \$30 per week plus mileage for each singer.** The motion passed.

2. 2. DCE/Deaconess/Outreach Consideration- Margaret opened a discussion on if there is any interest in pursuing someone to fill our previous DCE position. It was a discussed that a Deaconess may better suit our needs. Pastor Hayden will research the schools that provide Deaconess intern programs to understand the process and requirements. The council will discuss this at a future meeting, following Pastor Hayden's research.

The meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's Prayer.
