# Dear Friends in Christ,

As you know, Linda and I took some time away during July. We spent time with two of our children, with Linda's sister and her family, and with one another. We did have a wonderful time. I realized, however, that while different vacations require different preparations, it seems that all trips demand at least 2 things; clothes and money—and plenty of both.

Jesus was not on vacation as He traveled through Galilee. He was working; proclaiming repentance and the presence of God's kingdom. All the while He was also preparing those who traveled with Him to do the same. On two different occasions Jesus sent out His workers two by two (Luke 10:1 and Mark 6:7). For these journeys they were instructed to take along nothing except a staff—no bread, no bag of clothes, no money. They were to trust that God would provide food and lodging.

Maybe this is a good reminder that our life as a believer is not intended to be a vacation. We have work to do while we are in this world, God's message of love and forgiveness to share with those who are around us. For Christians, life's journey is not a sight-seeing trip, but a mission trip, for we are Christ's witnesses in the world. For this trip, every Christian does well to travel light, unencumbered by cares, pleasures, and greed. Peter remarked that he had no silver or gold; he had something better to offer—healing of body and soul.



Today, Jesus sends you and me out, not on a vacation, but on a mission. And He sends us out with a call to trust Him for all that we need. We may not always feel comfortable with Christ's call, we may not always feel prepared for the trip we are taking, but we always have God's promise to be with us and to supply all that we need to work in His name. And God will make it possible for you to have a good trip!

Dear Friends in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Thank you for your support of disaster relief in the Nebraska District. By sharing the blessings God has provided to you, you are helping those who have been affected by the flooding in Nebraska. Your prayers and financial support are greatly appreciated.

In the midst of the spring flooding, St. John Lutheran Church and School in Battle Creek opened their gym to the community as a clean, dry place for families to relax. St. John collected and dispersed nearly \$35,000 in aid to local families, unaware that groundwater was seeping into and warping their gymnasium floor. A grant from gifts like yours helps reduce the portion of the repair costs this congregation will need to pay. St. John has also received funds to help meet the needs of families in their community.

Camp Luther of Nebraska in Schuyler was able to make repairs to their lake facilities and road in time to serve their spring and summer campers. Camp Restore, established by Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Fremont, received grant money to help them in their goal of hosting and sending teams who will help communities in the surrounding area with repairs in the months to come. Disaster relief funds have also been granted to congregations in Cairo, Osmond, Verdigre, Columbus, Fremont, Stanton, and St. Edward so they can assist families, individuals, and businesses in their communities.
