What have you had to give up in order to be a Christian? Have you lost any friends because you're a believer? What about your job? Are your children barred from getting an education because your family goes to church regularly? Have your parents disowned you because you follow Christ?

These are odd questions for the month of December. During December we are much more accustomed to talking about what we hope to get, what we have gotten than about what we have had to give up. But not everywhere.

A wealthy native of India came to faith in Christ. Almost immediately after becoming a Christian, all that he owned was taken from him and his wife and children would no longer have anything to do with him. He was asked how he could bear these losses. He replied that many people had asked him that question, but that none had asked how he could bear his joys.

Certainly, this man found his joy in Christ and found reason to be thankful. He recognized that God's gifts were not limited to the type that we can put wrapping paper and bows on. The most important of all is the joy of the knowledge and presence of God in our lives every day.

The Apostle Paul talks about the attitude we should have "as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved." He encourages us to be compassionate and humble, to be kind and patient, and to forgive others as we have been forgiven. Most of all, He tells us to let Christ's peace reign in our heart "and to be thankful." (Colossians 3:12-15)

Too often, when we pray we put an agenda, a want list before God. We tell Him what we want Him to take care of: find that person a job, heal that other person, solve our money problems and keep our kids safe. We add our thanks as an afterthought. But that's not God's way. He tells us that we can even thank Him for the adversity He sends into our lives, for, as believers, we know that He uses all things for His glory and for our good (Romans 8:28). In fact, the Bible tells us, "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

This month in The Story we will read about people who have borne losses and people who have borne joys. As we celebrate Christmas this month, join me as we once again marvel at the wonder of God's love and grace for each of us shown in the manger at Bethlehem. This Christmas acknowledge again all that we are and all that we have is a gift to us from our heavenly Father. This Christmas, let us learn anew what it means to bear our joys; sharing God's Word of love and forgiveness by inviting a friend, a neighbor, a co-worker to worship here at Lake Oconee. Bring someone to church with you and receive the greatest gift of all—the joy of the Lord.

- ❖ Lay Ministry/Elder's report: Alan Oberdeck: Bob Elkins and Keith Mulford are retiring their service as elders and the congregation thanks them. Keith and Joan Mulford have been in service doing coffee fellowship for many years. Keith was thanked by the congregation for this service. A new person is needed to fill this responsibility. - Christian Service/Outreach: Laura Ringer: Operation Christmas child Shoeboxes are being collected. Other business will be in Pastor's report

  - Reiterated request for shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child
  - Explained the gift of 2000 free socks from Bombas. 1000 have already been disbursed. 500 to Circle of Love Ministry and 500 to Atlas Ministry. The remainder of the socks will be given to other charities in Putnam county, the shoe box Ministry or other Ministry.
  - Pastor thanked Barney Ross and the congregation for the new sound system.

- 3 New Logo options were presented and congregation asked to offer Pastor their views individually
- A door offering will be taken for the next few weeks for Greene County Christian Outreach

- Anderson fund was explained and discussed. These monies are to be used for Outreach. The Pastor and council suggest getting a DCE intern to focus on service and missions. The salary would come from the Anderson fund initially, then God willing, monies that previously were used for the mortgage could cover the cost. A DCE has a 12 month intern program so it would be a one year commitment. The church then has the opportunity to extend a call or not. A Decision will be needed by the end of January. If everything worked out, a DCE could be placed by Jun-Aug. LOLC must provide housing. Pastor asked that we begin praying about it now and we will meet again to follow protocol.
- Music director: there are 2 possible candidates to follow up on.

#### **New Business:**

Kathie Kueven: proposed a budget increase of \$3000 to include a 5% increase for Pastor and a 3% increase for church secretary. Also an increase to a weekly salary of \$150 for the pianist. Pastor prayed about the budget. A motion was given and seconded and all were in favor. Motion to approve the budget passed.

Elders: Donald Menke, Joseph Peeples

There was a call for nominations from the floor but none were given. Roger Martinson motioned that the requested election slate be accepted by acclimation. Keith Mulford seconded and it was unanimously approved.

The Davis Mortensen family has donated money to purchase the vacant land in front of the church. The land will be cleared to provide better visibility of the church.

The Presbyterian Church would like for LOLC to purchase a slice of property between our two churches. This property borders our drive from the corner where the blue sign is to the corner opposite our entrance. This will be taken under review.

Motion given to adjourn. Meeting was closed in prayer and adjourned.
