Dear Friends in Christ,

In the ESV Bible translation, the word "joy" or "rejoice" is used 57 times. As Christians, joy ought to be a characteristic of our lives. The Lutheran Study Bible notes, "Joy is not the ephemeral happiness that worldly pleasures bring, but the deep and abiding joy of being loved by God through Jesus Christ. It is an emotional appreciation for good things received. A result of God's grace toward believers." In this definition, we understand that joy is not based on circumstances. It is more than happiness that we can experience from positive situations and activities in life. Joy comes from recognizing that God is in control and that He loves us, even when we don't feel happy. When we look at what God has done for us, we respond with gratitude and joy.

Joy is a fruit of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). Each of the nine different fruit that are identified in the book of Galatians is given to us by God's grace. Joy is a grace bestowed on us by God. Someone once said, "The fullness of joy is to behold God in everything." Jesus tells

us, "These things I have spoken to you, that My joy be in you, and that your joy may be full" (John 15:11). When we abide in Jesus, we will have the fullness of His joy.

By God's grace, joy is part of our lives. Knowing who we are and whose we are, we are empowered to live lives filled with joy. When we abide in Jesus and live in obedience to Him our joy is made complete. We feed the hungry, give water to the thirsty, entertain the strangers, clothe the naked, and visit the sick and the prisoners (Matthew 25:37-39), all in the name of Jesus. Jesus tells us that when we love and serve others in His name, we are serving Him. God's Word directs us to use our time, talents, and money in ways that help others and extend His kingdom. When we use our blessings in obedience to God's will, we will experience even more joy.

Jesus said, "My joy be in you." That joy was manifested when, "for the joy that was set before Him [He] endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2). His joy was to bring us to heaven by the way of the cross. To fill us with joy, He was shamed and died. As we abide in Him and bear the fruit of faith, our joy is made full.

During our worship in September we will learn more about the joy that comes from abiding in Jesus and bearing fruit as we **Discover the Joy in Sharing God's Blessings**.

At the end of our emphasis, you will have the opportunity to submit a Time and Talent sheet and a Promise (Pledge) form in your service to God here at Lake Oconee. God will equip us to use our blessings in ways that give Him honor. God fills our hearts with love for Him and His Church, so we are energized to share our blessings with others. God gives true joy!

Our emphasis will start on September 1 in worship. May you know the joy of God.
